Prep Basketball Experience leads Durango to win over Valley

Sadat leads way for Trailblazers

Durango High School's experience wore down the Valley Vikings in the fourth quarter last Tuesday, in their 87-69 season opening win at the Valley gymnasium.

The Trailblazers finished with five players in double figures and their defense was anchored with 6-foot-8 senior center Ra'oof Sadat blocking seven shots in the game. He also scored a

game-high 25 points.

"Valley's a good team," said Durango head coach Al La Rocque. "The game was much closer than the final score. That's the team you won't want to play in March. But our guys in the low-post really played their hearts out and I think that was the difference tonight. Sadat is something special to watch."

Durango established themselves a superior low-post game with Sadat being complimented with senior forward Tyler Kidd scoring 20 points along with three thunderous dunks.

"He's the player that really gave us trouble," said Valley coach Paul Aznarez, of Kidd. "I thought he gave them a great one-two punch with Sadat. We never really adjusted to the intangibles of Kidd's game. We were out of sync on defense. Not moving our feet."

Durango pulled out to an early 27-13 first quarter lead before the Vikings' cut into the deficit behind point guard LaRontae Johnson (9 points and 8 assists) and Jevon Banks, nephew of former UNLV star Freddie Banks (17 points); to trail 40-35 at the half.

Valley would get as close as

55-52 in the opening minute of the fourth quarter before suffering a fatal defensive lapse against the state defending champions. The Trailblazers took a 15-6 run down the stretch of the game and would finish with 32 points for the final quarter.

"There was no yelling in our lockeroom after the game," said

Aznarez. "But you really have to wonder what kind of man-to-man defensive we were in. I don't know. But hey, next time we'll have to put together four full quarters to win."

Also scoring for Durango was Thomas McTyer (10 points), Kevon Jones (14 points), and Jared Call (14 points).




