Others, however, avoid milk and dairy products because of lactose intolerance — the inability to digest the sugar found in milk and other dairy products. According to the National Institutes of Health, between 30 million and 50 million Americans are lactose intolerant. Abdominal pain after eating dairy foods is the most common symptom of lactose intolerance. Other symptoms include gas, bloating, stomach cramps and diarrhea.

For those who are dieting or

lactose intolerant, experts recommend keeping dairy products, especially milk, in your diet. They are a major source of calcium that can help achieve and maintain peak bone mass. Lactose-reduced and lactose-free, farm fresh milk are available in both low-fat and nonfat varieties. Also, to prevent discomfort from lactose intolerance, lactase enzyme caplets can be taken before or with a meal containing dairy foods.

Regular exercise, along with a diet rich in calcium, which can

include products like Lactaid milk, can help teens and young women with lactose intolerance

maintain good bone mass and may reduce their risk of osteoporosis later in life.

News accounts were numerous after the *Journal of the American Medical Association (JAMA)* published an August 23 report about nifedipine and other short-acting CCBs based on one of many studies. "Other studies have drawn different conclusions," notes Schroeder. "We simply need more information, and a larger study is in fact under way to answer further questions about blood pressure medications.

"The study in JAMA didn't look at currently available once-a-day CCBs which are now used for treatment of hypertension (high blood pressure) and angina (chest pain caused by a blockage of blood flow to the heart). These agents have gained widespread use because of their effectiveness, their safety and their lack of adverse side effects. Therefore, the current findings do not apply to how we're practicing medicine now, even if the reported findings were conclusive," says Schroeder.
