UNLY travels to New Mexico State Saturday

Rebels to play host to state rival Nevada Reno

College athletics has long been known for its long-time rivalries. UCLA-Notre Dame, Army-Navy, Duke-North Carolina, are just a few collegiate rivalries that have lasted for decades.

Well, we have our own little college rivalry brewing right here in the state of Nevada with UNLV and the University of Nevada, Reno (UNR), and whether it be football, basketball or baseball, both camps want to hold the state's bragging rights.

Once again, the two schools will clash as UNLV's Runnin' Rebels play host to the Wolfpack of UNR on Monday, January 29 at the Thomas & Mack Center in a Big West Conference game that will be very important for both squads, aside from the fact they're playing for bragging rights.

The Rebels (3-4 in conference and 6-9 overall) have once again hit the skids as they have lost their last two contests to Cal-State Fullerton and UC Irvine — both games on the road—by a total of 8 points, and have dropped to a three-way tie for fifth place in the Big West with San Jose State and Pacific.

The Wolfpack (4-2 in conference and 11-5 overall), on the other hand, is off to its best start in 7 years. Currently, Reno is tied for first place in the conference standings with UC

Irvine, and has won four consecutive conference matches, three of which came at home last week.

While Sunshine Smith and the other Rebel guards have played rather inconsistent on offense, it has been the post playof forwards Clayton Johnson (17.1 points and 5.7 rebounds per game) and Warren Rosegreen (11.0 points and 11.2 rebounds per game) that have gotten the Rebels as far as they are. Against Reno, the Rebel backcourt will again be put to the test as they face UNR's leader, 6-4 senior guard Brian Green.

Green, who was named last week's Big West Player of the Week, is also second in conference scoring at 19.5 points per game and is second on the Wolfpack in rebounding at 5.0 per game. An All-Big West Conference Honorable Mention player last season as a junior, Green was also name the Big West tourney's MVP last spring.

In terms of the rivalry, the Rebels lead the series 42-13, however, in their most recent meetings, UNR has come out on top, beating UNLV twice last season — 84-73 in Reno and 73-57 last February at the Thomas & Mack, where the sharp-shooting Green had a game high 22 points.

But before the Rebels get too far ahead looking at their Monday match-up against their inter-state rivals, they first must travel to Las Cruces, NM to take on the Aggies of New Mexico State University this Saturday.

A Big West Conference powerhouse for several seasons, New Mexico State is currently in the rebuilding process as they have lost 9 members from last year's team, including all 5 starters.

The Aggies are led by 6-7 Jr. forward Enoch Davis who's averaging 14.7 points and 5.4 rebounds per game. They

suffered a huge loss earlier this month when they lost point guard Shawn Harrington for the season after a serious knee injury.

New Mexico beat the Rebels in all three of their meetings last season, two of them at the Thomas & Mack.
