JACKSONVILLE JAGUARS AT BALTIMORE RAVENS. Last Year: The Jags upset the former Cleveland Browns twice by scores of 23-15 and 24-21. Spread: Jaguars by 2-1/2.

NEW YORK JETS AT BUFFALO BILLS. Lifetime: Bills lead the series 41-31-0, and have outscored the Jets 1,403-1,1478 in their 72 meetings. Last Year: The Bills swept the Jets 29-10 and 28-26. Spread: Bills by 15.

ATLANTA FALCONS AT CINCINNATI BENGALS. Lifetime: Bengals lead the series 6-2-0, and have outscored the Falcons 183-137 in their eight meetings. Last Meeting: In 1993, the Bengals knocked off the Falcons 21-17. Spread: Bengals by 2.

DENVER BRONCOS AT MINNESOTA VIKINGS. Lifetime: Vikings lead the series 5-3-0, yet the Broncos have outscored the Vikings 175-166 in their eight meetings. Last Meeting: In 1993, the Vikings upset the Broncos 26-23 in overtime. Spread: Broncos by 2.

CAROLINA PANTHERS AT HOUSTON OILERS. Lifetime: This is the first meeting ever between these clubs. Spread: Oilers by 5-1/2.

INDIANAPOLIS COLTS AT NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS. Lifetime: Patriots lead the series 30-22-0, and have outscored the Colts 1,129-917 in their 52 meetings. Last Year: The Patriots swept the Colts 24-10 and 10-7. Spread: Patriots by 6.

SAN DIEGO CHARGERS AT KANSAS CITY CHIEFS. Lifetime: Chiefs lead the series 39-33-1, and have outscored the Chargers 1,510-1,405 in their 73 meetings. Last Year: The Chiefs swept the Chargers 29-23 and 22-7. Spread: Chiefs by 3.

Religious Freedom Week celebrated

Churches across America recently celebrated Religious Freedom Week to commemorate the Congressional passage of the First Amendment in 1789. Churches participating ranged from the famous Old North Church in Boston to the Founding Church of Scientology in Washington, D.C.

The celebration, recognized in September of each year, became an annual tradition after the U.S. Congress—with strong support from members of the Congressional Black Caucus passed resolutions in 1988, 1989 and 1990 officially declaring the last week in September as Religious Freedom Week.

"Religious freedom is one of the bedrock's of American life," said Rev. Sue Taylor, the national spokesperson for the Religious Freedom Week Committee. "Like most of our freedoms, it is something we take for granted, but this week we take time to reflect on both the power and richness of this freedom and our responsibility to protect it."
