Activist sues the city over redrawn wards

Community activist Beatrice Turner has filed a lawsuit in District Court against the city protesting new ward boundaries that she says are discriminatory to West Las Vegas.

In a Saturday interview published in the Las Vegas Review Journal., Turner said the Westside community will suffer from being lumped into Ward 3, which has a largely Hispanic population.
