DENVER BRONCOS AT GREEN BAY PACKERS. Lifetime: Broncos lead the series 4-2-1, and have outscored the Packers 135-124 in their seven meetings. Last Meeting: In 1993, the Packers beat the Broncos 30-27. Spread: Packers by 7-1/2

JACKSONVILLE JAGUARS AT HOUSTON OILERS. Lifetime: Oilers lead the series 2-1-0. Last Year: The Oilers beat the Jags 10-3, but were later upset by the Jags 17-16. Spread: Oilers by 6.

NEW YORK GIANTS AT MIAMI DOLPHINS. Lifetime: Giants lead the series 2-1-0, and have outscored the Dolphins 52-40. Last Meeting: In 1993, the Giants beat the Dolphins 19-14. Spread: Dolphins by 7.

NEW YORK JETS AT NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS. Lifetime: Jets lead the series 39-33-1, and have outscored their northern rivals 1,610-1,592 in their 73 meetings. Last Year: The Patriots swept the Jets 20-7 and 31-28. Spread: Patriots by 12.

Valley, too will be strong in the backcourt with the tandom of seniors Jevon Banks and LaRontae Johnson. Banks, nephew of former Valley High and UNLV star Freddie Banks, to some, is another candidate for the "best guard in town" honors, while Johnson, who was the conference Offensive Most Valuable Player in football, is probably the south's quickest guard along with Las Vegas' Finley.

Like Las Vegas, however, the Vikings will be lacking in size as they lost J. Johnson, the southern conference's leading rebounder to graduation.

More experienced than a year ago, Rancho High School will also be athreat in the Sunrise. The Rams, playing mostly sophomores, lost eight games by three points or less last season. This year, experience will be on their side. And having long-range shooter Arthur Ireland, a first-team all-conference selection who averaged 19.6 points per game last year, back in the lineup will definitely be a plus.

Basic could also end up a division threat. Returning three starters — all seniors — the Wolves, led by first-team all-division player Damon Caldwell (19.8 points and 10.1 rebounds per game last season) and Darrell Rivas (12.2 rebounds per game) and Kelly Calverly, will be one of the better rebounding teams in the conference.

Then there's Green Valley. This year the Gators, unlike their Sunrise Division foes, may be short handed at the guard position after losing shooter Tom Truman, the conference's third-leading scorer (21 points per game) to graduation. But what they lack up front, they will more than make up for down low. Green Valley will be led by one of the, if not the most talented sophomore in the city, Demetrius Hunter. The Gators will also be aided by 6-6, 255-pound senior center Mike Jones.

Rounding out the Sunrise Division will be the rebuilding Chaparral High School Cowboys; the Eldorado Sundevils, playing under their third head coach in three years and the Roadrunners of Vo-Tech.

The regular season, which began Tuesday, started off with a bang as the two division's toprated teams squared off in the season opener.

In the contest, the Las Vegas Wildcats dominated the host Western Warriors from the opening tip to post an impressive 100-76 win.

Before a packed house, the quicker Wildcats used a full-court press to cause the Warriors to turn the ball over 34 times in the game. Though smaller, the Wildcats' scrappy defense didn't allow Western to utilize their big men as expected. Lawhorn (18 points, 11 rebounds) and White did manage to combine for 30 of Western's points, but their height advantage never posed a threat to Las Vegas.

The Wildcats, using an eightman rotation, were led by Ronnie Jones' 23 points, eight of which came off three long jump shots in one minute's time in the fourth quarter to put the game out of reach.
