

Shawn "Puffy" Combs, Steve Harvey and Snoop Doggy Dogg

Rappers make peace on TV

In a declaration of peace, two of the biggest names in rap, West Coast rapper Snoop Doggy Dogg and East Coast rap producer Sean "Puffy" Combs will unite to dispel the long-running rumors of a violent rivalry between the East and West Coast factions of rap music. The two rap artists will be appearing together publicly for the first time, in an episode of The WB's "The Steve Harvey Show." The episode is scheduled to air Sunday, February 23 (8:30-9:00 p.m. ET) on The WB.

The move was brought about largely through the efforts of Steve Harvey after he approached Snoop Doggy Dogg and Sean "Puffy" Combs separately on the set of "Showtime at the Apollo," a variety show also hosted by Harvey. Harvey implored

the rap artists to appear together to shatter the rumors of an east-west rivalry, speculated to have resulted in incidents of violence. Although Spike Lee and others have attempted to bring the rap artists together, they have chosen the television comedy arena of "The Steve Harvey Show," set in an inner city high school, as the forum to make their statement.

In the episode, entitled "I Do, I Don't," Snoop Doggy Dogg and Sean "Puffy" Combs each approach Steve Hightower (Steve Harvey) for permission to sample music from the Hi-Tops, Steve's former group, in their latest raps. When Steve refuses to give either of them permission as long as there remains bad blood between them, they inform him and his class that the rumors of an east-west rivalry were completely unfounded all along.
