THE HUMAN MIND WORKS:

Understanding the power of both the conscious and unconscious minds

For those seeking to take control of their destinies, nothing will assist your efforts like fully grasping the differences between the conscious (aware, logical) mind and the unconscious (unaware) mind.

Dr. Sigmund Freud, the father alleged psychoanalytic theory, surmised after years of study and clinical observation, that human beings are not only guided by the conscious decisions of our conscious minds, we are inexorably directed by an incredibly powerful unconscious mind which is lodged within the human psyche as a non-stop tape recorder.

This "tape recorder," whose capacity endows each of us with a photographic memory, began collecting data while we were still snugly cradled in our mothers' wombs. Every feeling, every thought, and every occurrence that the individual experienced overt or subtle - is remembered and stored in the unconscious mind.

Some people use the terms unconscious mind and subconscious mind interchangeably. For purposes of clarification, we will define the subconscious mind as the

reservoir of our emotions and as the servant — genius, that when persistently programmed with directed thoughts, clear pictures (creative visualization), and strong feelings will bring our desires to fulfillment.

The conscious mind, on the other hand, is the ordergiver. The conscious mind has no memory capacity. It judges, it wills, it decides. Affirmations emanate from the conscious mind. Whatever comes to our awareness through the five senses and/or our present thoughts constitute the conscious mind.

An easy — if somewhat inept—analogy would be what you observe after you pour a glass of Coke or Pepsi. The dark part — the concentrated essence of the soda represents the unconscious

The more ephemeral, foaming substance (that which is at the top of the soda) would represent the conscious mind. Conscious thoughts are fleeting; unconscious thoughts are stored indefinitely.

Dr. Carl Jung, contemporary of Dr. Sigmund Freud, took it one step further. He hypothesized that not only did individuals have both a conscious and unconscious mind, but so do groups. So, for example, the thoughts and feelings that construct the personal identities or selfconcepts (i.e., what we think and feel about ourselves) of individuals may be multiplied to reflect what groups think and feel about themselves.

For centuries, we, African Americans, were bombarded with negative messages about our innate value as human beings. Indelible impressions about our self-worth, our collective intelligence, our relative beauty, even how much we should trust one another have been programmed into our group (collective) unconscious mind.

To begin the process of reprogramming our minds — as individuals and as a group we should follow some variation of the 10-step plan below to elevate our individual and group self-esteem:

1. Become aware of the some 20,000 thoughts (coming from the unconscious mind) that run through your head Remember: everyday. Focusing on worries, doubts, and fears drain your energy

2. Listen intently to the non-stop conversation (inside your head) that you are always having with yourself. Ask yourself whether or not you are making matters worse than they really are.

3. Decide as soon as possible what you think your purpose in life is (your role in the cosmic plan).

4. Decide what your highest single priority is.

5. Write down three specific, measurable goals with attendant dates for attainment, along with a brief explanation of why you want what you

6. Avoid negative generalizations about people and situations.

7. Use partial solutions to begin problem-solving. Graduate to your master

8. Make fear's energy work for and not against you.

9. Use positive affirmations to guide your plans and to direct your statements about yourself, your circumstances, and other

10. Always remember that you are powerful beyond description and that, momentby-moment, if you choose to be guided by active faith, literally "Nothing shall be impossible unto you."

Black women protest tribute to suffragettes

It has taken 32 years to have a 13 ton marble tribute to three women suffragettes returned to the Capital Rotunda, but a black women's group wants the statue kept out of sight.

Although the National Political Caucus of Black Women initially supported efforts to have the statute placed at the Rotunda, the group has decided that until Sojourner Truth, the former slave, abolitionist and champion of voting rights for women is chiseled into the marble, they will not support

The statue was a gift to Congress and honors Susan B. Anthony, Lucretia Mott and Elizabeth Cady Stanton.

Known as the Portrait Monument and created by Adelaide Johnson, the piece was commissioned in 1920 by the National Women's Party and presented to Congress the following year. Shortly after, it was removed from the Rotunda and placed on a first floor corridor.

Karen Stasser, president of National Museum of Women's History in Alexandria, Va. said she could find no documentation to prove that the ex-slave was ever intended to be a part of the statue.

Sojourner Truth's contributions are not being disputed, but there is doubt that the women's movement led by white middle class women would have included a poor black woman who could not read or write.

Civil right activist, C. Delores Tucker said that the statue has to include Truth if it is supposed to represent suffragettes. "History has been distorted enough. We don't need it

Truth spoke at equal rights conventions and campaigned for Ulysses S. Grant. She also tried to vote on two occasions, but was not allowed to.

Women's groups launch campaign in support of Alexis Herman

At a recent press conference, several of the nation's largest women's organizations and other political supporters, launched a campaign urging Senate confirmation hearings for Alexis Herman, the nominee for U.S. Secretary of Labor. Herman is the only Clinton

cabinet nominee who has not yet had a confirmation hearing

Sen. Carol Mosely Braun (D-Ill.) termed the delay "Wonder in Alice Land," because she says she has been unable to ascertain the reason for the hesitation from neither republican nor democratic senators. Dr. Dorothy Height, president of the National Council of Negro Women said there should be no doubt about Herman's confirmation. "Alexis is well qualified professionally and personally she understands the issues affecting people and she will be a good, Secretary of Labor. She knows how to get the job done and she knows what is needed in the black community."

The coalition believes that Herman's experience as former director of the Labor Department's women's bureau and as co-chair of a Presidential Task Force To Promote Business Ownership For

Women under President Carter, makes her uniquely qualified for this position. She has also led the fight for equal employment opportunities for women and people of color as head of the Minority Women Employment program.

There is much speculation that Sen. Jeffers (R-Vt.), chair of the Senate Hearing Committee, will soon set a hearing date for the week of March 10. The coalition of women's groups includes: National Political Congress of Black Women, Feminist Majority, National Organization for Women, National Women's Political Caucus, American Association of University Women and Wider Opportunities for Women. Other groups strongly supporting the campaign include: The Black Leadership Forum, Inc., NAACP Legal and Education Defense Fund, the National Publishers Newspaper Association and the African-American Leadership Family.


