

# Quarterback, defense lift Valley, 27-20

Quarterback Dion Jackson had a hand in all of Valley's scoring. He threw for three touchdowns and rushed for another.

But it was the defense intercepting a pair of fourth passes in the red zone to preserve Valley's 27-20 victory over Chaparral last Thursday night.

Jackson threw for 251 yards on 13 for 21 passing with two interceptions. He also led Valley in rushing with 122 yards on 19 carries.

"That quarterback did an outstanding job for them tonight," said Jordan Phee. "When we would come at him up the middle, he would run outside on us. When we come at him from the corners, he'd bust us up the middle."

The Vikings improved to 5-2 overall, 4-1 in the Sunrise Division. The Cowboys fell to

Valley's two big interceptions came at key moments in the fourth quarter.

The first came on the first play of the fourth quarter. With Chaparral facing a fourth and goal play on Valley's 14-yard line, Bobby Palacio picked off Tyson Dobbs's pass in the end zone.

Forty second later, Jamal Holdip intercepted Dobbs pass at the Valley 11-yard line to end a Cowboy scoring drive.

After Palacio's pick, Valley drove 80 yards for a score. Jackson tossed a screen pass on the right side to Rayshone McClendon, which he broke 29 yards to make the score 27-14 early in the fourth. The key play on the drive was a 51-yard run by Jackson on third and 11

from the Viking 19.

After a 62-yard run on the first drive of the game by McClendon, Jackson scored on a 1-yard run up the middle to make it 7-0.

Late in the second, after a Chaparral touchdown, Artis Carhee caught a Jackson pass and sliced 64 yards for a touchdown to put Valley ahead for good.

After Valley recovered a fumbled punt return, Brian Beaver hauled in a 34-yard touchdown pass from Jackson to make it 19-6 with 9:55 left in the third quarter.

Even though Dobbs ran in two touchdowns of 1 and 17, he did most of his work through the air. He completed 10-of-19 passes for 221 yards and a touchdown.
