Spartans roll over Cheyenne, 46-14

Cimarron-Memorial has relied on the running game all season long, but Toby Smeltzer put the load on his shoulders last Friday night.

The Spartan quarterback threw for a season-high four touchdowns and ran for a fifth as Cimarron beat up on Chevenne, 46-

The victory put Cimarron back in first place of the Sunset Division at 5-1 because Durango upset Western, 26-24.

Cheyenne and Western, a half-game back at 4-1, go head to head next Friday in the regular season finale. If the Desert Shields beat Western, Cimarron will be the Sunset's No. 1 playoff seed. If Western wins, they are the No.1 seed.

While the offense are up 450 yards, Cimarron's defense held Cheyenne to only 211 yards and eight first downs.

Down 10-0 in the second, Cheyenne got on the scoreboard on a 27-yard TD pass from quarterback Lawrence Turner to Ledal Marshall on the left sideline to make it 10-7, the closest the Desert Shields would get in the game.

"We had to focus in on stopping the big play," said defensive tackle Dustin Topper. "They don't have the kind of team that is going to run 15, 20 yards for a score."

Take away big plays by Marshall and a 52yard TD run by William O'Neal, Cheyenne amassed only 132 total yards of offense. Cimarron also shut down one of the best

Turner to rush for minus-four yards on seven

Cimarron also stifled the passing attack, allowing Cheyenne quarterback Turner only 2 completions on five pass attempts for 65 yards.

A good example of Turner's ineffectiveness was on a play just before halftime. Trying to escape from a Cimarron blitz, he scrambled himself to a 25-yard sack and a safety to make the score 19-7 at halftime.

Smeltzer was 7-of-13 passing for 190 yards and ran in a one-yard TD in the second quarter. Later in the second, Smeltzer connected with running back Arnold Parker on a middle seam route 28 yards downfield to put Cimarron up

His next two TD passes came off a pair of screen passes to fullback Leonard DeRoche for 38 and 81 yards in the third quarter to put the game out of the reach.

Smeltzer had a hand in 38 of Cimarron's 42 points, he kicked five extra points and a 23yard field goal that opened up the scoring.

Seven of the eight Southern Conference Zone playoff spots are clinched with Cimarron, Western, Cheyenne, and Durango holding spots in the Sunset Division; Green Valley, Valley and Chaparral have spots in Sunrise.

The last playoff spot is up for grabs between Las Vegas and Eldorado. Even though Eldorado beat the Wildcats last week 39-29, if Las Vegas wins they will go to the playoffs. But if Las Vegas loses and the Sundevils win, they will go into the postseason.
