(Continued from Page 5) charge—between 2.75 percent and 5 percent — and modest annual supervisory/maintenance fees.

• Payment options. Depending on the type of UIT you choose, interest or dividends may be paid monthly (on many bond UITs), quarterly (onmany stock UITs) or twice yearly. In some trust arrangements, you may choose to automatically reinvest interest and principal distributions into the same UIT.

• Selling flexibility. You can sell a UIT at any time before maturity. When you sell, the price may be higher or lower than the original purchase price and you could incur tax consequences, depending on the current value of the underlying securities.

(Continued from Page 1) vehicle type and other factors identifying people police believe more likely to be involved in crimes.

The U.S. Supreme Court has ruled that the Constitution protects motorists against selective law enforcement based on such factors as race. But the court also has ruled that police generally can stop motorists for traffic violations even when the officers are really looking for evidence of other illegal activity such as drug use.

Prosecutors have attempted to block Campbell's lawyer from mentioning race-based profiling to the jury.

The Orange County sheriff's office wouldn't comment on the case before trial, and a gag order was imposed for jury selection.

The office's spokesmen have said the department doesn'tuserace-based profiles. But an analysis last summer by the Orlando Sentinel newspaper showed the Orange County drug squad that patrols the Florida Turnpike carries out 6 1/2 times as many searches on black motorists pulled over in traffic as on whites.

In Campbell's case, he was stopped for an alleged improper lane change and having an obscured license tag, which has been legally challenged. Campbell disputes that he made an improper lane change.

After he was pulled over, Campbell got out of his car and handed his license to Cpl. Richard Mankewich, who is white. Campbell identified himself as a police officer and told the deputy he was carrying

Campbell also said, according to the police report: "I know you Orange County guys, you're not going to — with me."

The traffic stop deteriorated into an angry verbal confrontation with Campbell finally being wrestled to the ground by deputies.

scientists announced that humans may have contracted the disease by eating diseased beef.

No U.S. cases have ever been reported. But eating meat from cattle tainted by the disease is believed to have killed at least 20 people overseas, mostly in Britain.

The cattlemen are claiming more than \$12 million in damages, citing severe price drops. Winfrey's show aired during a time when cattlemen were crippled by drought, high feed prices and oversupply.

Winfrey, and her Harpo Productions Inc. and distributor King World Productions say the show was only keeping the public informed.

"I maintain my right to ask questions and to hold a public debate on issues that impact the general public and my audience," Winfrey said shortly after the show aired.
