There have been dance troupes built around anthropological investigations; there have been dance troupes that grew out of political movements. But the Urban Bush Women are a category unto themselves. In fact, given the breadth and freedom of their art, they defy categorization. They are a powerful ensemble that has perfected a multi-disciplinary art form that 'creates poetry without words' and conveys black expression.


Founded by Jawole Willa Jo Zollar in 1984, Urban Bush Women expand the definition of modern dance - incorporating acappella vocals, spoken-word narration and theatrical performance. The result has been rave reviews and sold-out houses from Tel Aviv to Tallahassee for their unique in-your-face choreography. In 1994 they landed the prestigious Capezio Dance
