Links-backed play boosting Booker pupils pride

Links volunteers are working with Kermit Booker Prime 6 School pupils on a special performance of "The Wiz" set for Thursday, April 23 at the West Las Vegas Library Theater, 951 W. Lake Mead Blvd.

Members of Links' local chapter began working with the pupils months before a state study tabbed the elementary school as one of 13 "inadequate" schools statewide. The designation resulted from a high number of Booker pupils scoring below state averages on standardized tests.

The pupils have taken to acting.

"When the students first came to the theater, they were so shy they almost didn't want to give their names," Links Delores spokeswoman Pasquito said. "With little previous experience in performing, they were quiet and intimidated. On stage, they wouldn't face the audience.

Their heads were cast down. Now we have to be assertive to keep them quiet."

Thanks to the Links' compassion and enthusiasm, the children are brimming with confidence. They stand tall in rehearsal, belting out lines they worked hard to memorized.

"They're so excited and so proud of themselves," Pasquito

Eager to enhance educational opportunities for disadvantaged youth, the Links, a network of black professional women, decided to reach out to the school.


now boasts chapters in 240 cities, each dedicated to a fourfold mission: involvement in national trends, international trends, the arts and services to the youth.
