Though an honors student and excellent baseball player -he pitches and plays centerfield - he was worried about his future because he wasn't getting feedback from any colleges. EliteXposure changed that. Eight colleges responded to Farmer's inquiries. Soon, Winder got a phone call from the assistant coach at Texas Southern.

Winder will receive more than \$10,000 in scholarships and financial aid that he can renew annually to complete planned studies in business and criminal justice, with hopes of eventually working in the CIA or FBI, not in a major league ballpark.

Winder earned a weighted 3.5 grade point average. Farmer said the higher the student-athletes' grades, the less of a selling job he has to do.

Winder is a bit anxious about going to college. He's lived in Las Vegas all his life. Next week, he and a buddy will make the drive to Houston. He says leaving home is part of life.

The program is open to any high school athletes. The onetime fee ranges from \$199 for freshmen to \$299 for seniors.

NLV city council since 1983 was upset that Hinson did not get a personnel session where her personal weaknesses and strengths could be pointed out.

Robinson said Hinson's performance as city manager was extraordinary. Hinson was dismissed because the City of North Las Vegas is headed in a new direction, North Las Vegas officials said. Hinson's supporters who weren't satisfied with that answer expressed their frustration last Wednesday.

"We are on a huge growth curve and are changing the way we (NLV) do business with the public," Council woman Paula Brown said. "We (the city council) have an opportunity to explore other avenues for city manager."

Councilman John Rhodes, the lone African-American on the City Council, has been critisized for voting to oust Hinson.

"There's no understanding about Councilman Rhodes," Scott said. "We don't know if he's right, to the left, black or white."

In November newly elected North Las Vegas Mayor Montandon unsuccessfully pushed to get Hinson out of office.

Hinson's contract has a 60-day notice of renewal which will expire in October. She will receive a severance package
