NASSAU, Bahamas (AP) — Oprah Winfrey basked in the sunshine and served up sexy topics for her talk show, a much-ballyhooed topic itself amid reports that she is planning to leave it.

Bahamas taping shows Friday, remained coy about the attention. In London last week, Winfrey was quoted by The Sunday Times as saying she was fed up with escalating sleaze on daytime TV talk

shows, especially by rival host Jerry Springer, and that she planned to quit her show when her contract ends in two years. She seemed taken aback when locals asked her about her plans and her criticism of Springer.

James Brown endorses Ill. candidate

CHICAGO (AP) — The Godfather of Soul says he feels good — about Pervis Spann, a candidate for alderman. The singer arrived at Spann's South Side campaign headquarters in a white stretch limousine Sunday to endorse the candidate, a disc jockey and part owner of WVON-AM, as a man who "understands our problems."

Incumbent Thomas Murphy quickly pointed out that he, too, is a fan of James Brown, who was in the area for a concert in Hammond, Ind.

But Brown told the group of about 25 supporters that Spann was his man. "Vote him in with no problem," Brown said. "And don't even think about nothing else."
