While specifical-ly targeting the Haitian community, using Creole talk radio, Celestin also went after the Black and Hispanic votes, estimated to be about 7,000 and 3,000 respectively.

In polling on May 11, Celestin had received 2,263 votes ahead of Frank Wolland who got 1, 623, Anthony Caserta who got 855 and Ted Ravelo who polled only 254 votes. However, having failed
