The modern day plague of AIDS is twenty years old. Golden Rainbow's "Ribbon of Life" program, an entertainment spectacular that raises funds to assist HIVpositive and AIDS-afflicted individuals, is fifteen years old. Throughout those fifteen years, Ribbon of Life has been a celebration of triumph in the midst of the AIDS tragedy.

Golden Rainbow is a nonprofit organization that provides housing and financial help to men, women and children affected by the, as yet, incurable disease. The organization's Ribbon of Life benefit was held in the Mandalay Bay Theater on June 16 and 17.

Through song, dance and words of encouragement, the production sent a message of hope to the HIV/AIDS community. The uplifting, entertaining and educational show is the product of the efforts of

The Las Vegas Branch's Charter was formally suspended April 21, by a unanimous vote of the NAACP National Board of Directors. The action came after hear-

ings were held in Las Vegas regarding the branch's election violations and several other infractions. Results of the election were also nullified by the suspension.

The suspension is the second action taken by the NAACP's National Board toward the Las Vegas Branch within the past three years.

Suspension of the Las Vegas Branch Charter means that there is no official NAACP activity taking place. The general members are "atlarge," members. There are no NAACP officers, no executive committee. There is not even a Las Vegas NAACP

Tuesday night's meeting was called by Nelson Rivers III, director NAACP's National Field Operations, to discuss the status of operations and to give the membership a national office up-
