6. He is responsible for assuring that the financial affairs of the Branch are carried out in accordance with NAACP policy and procedure.

7. He would be responsible for assuring that the Branch has a plan for the purpose of paying off debt to the National Office, however, the Branch has no debt to the National Office.

> 9. He has the final authority on any and all local policy matters voted by the general membership of the Branch.

10. He supervises the Branch's membership cam-

11. He supervises the Branch's fundraising efforts.

12. He reports to the National Office and National Board of Directors on a periodic basis as to the progress the Branch is making.

13. He has authority to delegate duties and tasks as appropriate.

14. Other duties, responsibilities and authority may be assigned to him by the National Board of Directors.

The national office will not tolerate anything less than complete adherence to the group's constitution and bylaws contained in the "White Book," Rivers said.

Several lengthy training sessions for the general membership and the reorganization committee will be held to make everyone knowledgeable about the rules set forth the White Book, he said.

Although the appointment of an administrator is not outlined in the White Book, it is the policy developed by NAACP through the study of its 92 years of meeting minutes. It is policy that has been tested in the courts, Rivers


