(Continued from Page 13) to think that a brown or black dude who is a U.S. citizen with a pound of smoke in the glove compartment of his car represents the same threat. Under the law that was just passed, both could be subjected to the same treatment.

While certainly not as consequential as our country's present national crisis, the University of Nevada System Board of Regents and the Clark County School District Board of Trustees seem bent on defining the right to equal public educational opportunity as an implied and conferred privilege of the ruling

The issues that I am talking about have received a fair amount of media coverage. Recapping here, the issues are the inequity that exists between per capita spending for schools in low-income neighborhoods versus upperincome communities for K-12 schools, and the proposed raising of the grade-pointaverage entry requirement for students desiring to attend publicly supported universities in Reno and Las Vegas.

These inequities can only exist in a climate where too trusting and/or apathetic citizens assume that their elected officials are more committed to protecting their rights than to self-aggrandizement. While we certainly have a right to think this is the case, it is a privilege that we can ill afford for our children.

Most of us who are well past the age of majority have experienced things in our lives that allow us to understand that in a number of instances, in matters of consequence, the irrational often triumphs over the obvious. The foregoing are clear examples of wanting to believe

During the decade-long conflict, Sierra Leon's Revolutionary United Front rebels raped, maimed and killed tens of thousands of civilians in a campaign to seize control of the government and lucrative diamond fields.

They signed - and abandoned - three peace accords before agreeing to the latest cease-fire.

Peace efforts moved forward this year as the rebels came under heavy pressure from British troops, the military of neighboring Guinea and a U.N. peacekeeping force that is the world's largest.
