ban planning. Most graduate with three-year broad Bachelor's degrees or diplomas.

Moreover, for every Black graduate in the fields of commerce, mathematics, and engineering there are two Whites. There are three times as many White as Black graduates in computer science, and an enormous eight times as many in the field of industrial arts, trades, and technology

In contrast, Black graduates outnumber Whites by 10 to one in education, and by three to one in language and literature, public administration, and social services.

While the government tries to address these imbalances through such measures as merging higher education institutions and improving school-level math and science, it is clear that inherited structural inadequacies in the education system will linger for some time.

Only 15 percent of Black higher-grade candidates passed the 2000 matrix exams in math and science. It is thus hardly surprising that only 17 percent of awards to Blacks (compared to 35 percent to Whites) are in the natural sciences.

"His words are music to the ears of those who wallow in being cast as victims. We may blame apartheid for child rapes, and violent abuse of the girl-child and woman-so it's sort of understandable, justified and all right.

"Blaming apartheid is seized upon by the misfits of our nation as the ultimate absolution of all their sins, and carte blanche to sin again.

"With that mentality, the moral fiber of South Africa will never be restored, national dignity and pride will never be regained," the newspaper said in an editorial. The Natal Witness, which

proposed that the government establish a department of HIV/AIDS, says the link with HIV/AIDS is plain because of the shocking belief by some traditional healers that sexual intercourse with a virgin is a cure for the disease.

"Another World AIDS Day has come and gone, the pandemic continues and increases. An estimated 5,000 people die each week in South Africa of AIDS-related diseases," the newspaper said.

"If a war were to be producing these figures, government would long since have treated this as a national emergency and responded accordingly."

Sunday's referendum on a draft constitution is being held under an agreement brokered last February by the Organization of African Unity, France and la Francophonie, an organization of French-speaking na-

If the constitution is approved, a government of national unity will be formed to prepare the Comoros for elections to return the impoverished country of 700,000 off Africa to civilian rule.

Moheli, Anjouan and Grande Comore - the three islands of the Comorian republic - obtained independence from France in 1975. A fourth island, Mayotte, voted against independence and remained a French overseas territory.

In 1997, Moheli and Anjouan announced plans to secede in an attempt to achieve a status similar to that of Mayotte. France rebuffed the attempt, and Comoros government troops managed to put down the secession on Moheli but failed on Anjouan.

Military ruler Azali Assoumane Assoumane, who took power himself in a bloodless April 1999 coup, said Friday that indications were that the coup attempt was staged by "some Comorian with Paris backing."

On Saturday, Interior Minister Sheikh named the suspected Comorian as Ahmed Achrafi, a former government official now living in France.
