much about the owner, William Brown, a free black man from Massachusetts who started work polishing shoes on the streets of Virginia City when he arrived in the early 1860s.

Brown opened a saloon at another town location in 1864 then moved to a prime location at D and Union streets in 1866 - "in the heart of the bustling business district across

the street from Piper's Opera House near the red light district," Dixon said.

"The fact it operated for nearly nine years shows it must have been a wonderful success. Mining boom towns had businesses that came and went quickly. Some were open for only months."

The town's Territorial Enterprise - where Mark Twain launched his writing career as a

newspaper reporter in 1862 - described the Boston Saloon in 1866 as "the popular resort for many of the colored population."

An 1875 article by a correspondent for the Pacific Appeal, a black newspaper based in San Francisco, lamented the closing of the saloon and the fact "we've been without a place of recreation for our own."

Lonnie Feemster, past president of the

Reno-Sparks NAACP, said discoveries like those at the Boston Saloon demonstrate the importance of teaching black history.

"This history needs to be carried into our school curricula to ensure that African-American children are not perceived as inferior and to ensure that they do not perceive themselves as inferior," he said.
