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the DNA had been removed. The embryo was grown in a test tube for eight days before being transferred into a third cow, a Simmenthaler cross, which acted as the surrogate mother.

"The DNA of Futhi matches 100 percent with that of the cow from whose ear she originates," De la Rey says. He says the calf's markings are the same as the donor mother's, with slight variations because she came from another uterus.

On Apr. 19 De la Rey and his team performed a Caesarian section to ensure that nothing went wrong with the birth. A Jersey cow is suckling Futhi.

De La Rey says cloning animals holds no ethical dilemma for him. "We are not playing God, we are only taking the life that God gave to humans to reproduce new creatures. Only God can give life," he says.

The world's first cloned animal — Dolly the sheep — died prematurely of a heart attack.

Barry says because the donor cells are taken from old donors such as that of Futhi's ancestor, there is no way to know if you have taken a new cell or an old cell.

"The cells of old animals have already gone through their cell cycles. This may have an impact on the life cycle of the animal," he says. In Dolly's case she died of a symptom that usually only occurs in elder animals.

But De La Rey says that technology is improving daily to improve cloning.

"The survival rate of cloned animals was at present lower than that of their 'normal' counterparts. That was the same with in-vitro technology at first," he says. "There is no reason to think that the calf will have a different life expectancy or ability to produce milk than her mother."

"One should take into account that cloning technology was now where in-vitro techniques were 20 years ago," he says.

Meanwhile, in the United States, where cloning of dairy cows is several years old, the Federal Department of Agriculture has not approved milk from cloned cows for public consumption.

The city council later voted on Councilmember Jan Perry's motion to rename the park in honor of White. South Park Recreation Center will be renamed the Barry White South Park Recreation Center.

Hamilton said a new high school to relieve overcrowding at Fremont will be built on Site 23, and his department is looking at three potential sites in the southern part of Manual Arts' attendance area to build a school to accommodate 1,000 students to solve overcrowding in that high school. Fremont students, trying to impress upon the official the urgency of their plight, said the school's hallways are so crowded now that they are unable to navigate them to get to their classes on time.

"I know Fremont is badly overcrowded and you need relief now, but it takes a year for the planning and design of a new school, a year to acquire the land on which to build it and two years for the actual construction," Hamilton explained.
