Sylvia Delgado, a Lancaster woman whose parents are buried in the cemetery-her mother since 1959 and father since 2001said maintenance has improved in the last few years. While many monuments bore visible decay and some areas needed mowing, a maintenance worker labored at that task on a riding mower.

"We have had some vandalism, such as flowers stolen from the graves," said Delgado. "But I think they're trying to make it appear

Delgado and others said they didn't know of any bodies being paved over at Oakland Cemetery.

But the same cannot be said for a pauper's cemetery behind Oakland.

After some residents raised questions in 2000 over whether parts of Opportunity Park

and People's Baptist Church on Pine Street were built on graves, the city hired an archaeologist to check.

Dermer said.

Alan Skinner determined that no graves were under the church or park but said there could be some south of Pine Street in an undeveloped area.

"I'll take his word for it, but it still seems very odd indeed that the city and county pauper cemetery was not used to its fullest extent," said Davidson. "I mean, Freedman's was so full that they occasionally and inadvertently stacked burials two and three deep."
