and abroad as a hero who preached racial reconciliation to his apartheid-scarred nation despite the 27 years he spent imprisoned by the white, racist regime.

Guests at the banquet included celebrities such as Oprah Winfrey, Robert DeNiro, South African President Thabo Mbeki and former President South African President F.W. de Klerk, who released Mandela from prison in 1990 and later shared the Nobel Peace Prize with him.

In his earlier speech, Clinton laid out a three-step plan he said Western nations could use to help raise Africa out of poverty. It included relieving Africa's foreign debt, increasing trade and helping to "unleash huge amounts of resources" for development.

Addressing an audience that included retired Anglican Archbishop Desmond Tutu, rock musician Bono and Queen Beatrix of the Netherlands, Clinton was interrupted several times by applause during a speech in which he compared Mandela to Mahatma Gandhi.

He spoke at length about his family's attachment to Mandela. It began when he and his daughter, Chelsea, watched a television broadcast of Mandela "walking to his freedom" in 1990.

"I am only his third-big-

gest fan in my family," Clinton said, bringing a wide smile to Mandela, who received a hug from Hillary Clinton.

Bill Clinton also spent considerable time outlining what he felt were the continent's priorities - the

menace of AIDS, the need for education, and the success of democracies.

Offering prayers before the meal, Tutu praised Mandela, using his clan name, Madiba.

"We thank God for you, Madiba, for teaching us to

forgive," Tutu said.

At the end of the evening Mandela and his third wife, Graca Machel, danced in a group that included the Clintons.

Transportation Notice Public Information Meeting I-515 Corridor Study



Purpose of Meeting: The Nevada Department of Transportation will conduct a series of open house meetings to seek community input into the I-515 Corridor Study. The goal of the study is to address the Valley's growing travel demands by developing plans for short-term and long-term improvements to I-515 and the surrounding surface transportation system.

The study focuses on the I-515 freeway corridor in the southeast portion of Las Vegas Valley. The corridor begins at the I-15/U.S.95 (I-515) interchange (known as the Las Vegas Spaghetti Bowl) and ends at the Foothill Grade Separation near the Railroad Pass Hotel/Casino, in Henderson.

When and Where: The first open house meeting will be Tuesday, July 29, 2003 from 4:00-7:00 p.m., at the East Las Vegas Community Senior Center, Multi-Purpose Room, 250 N. Eastern Ave., Las Vegas, Nevada.

A second open house meeting will be Wednesday, July 30, 2003 from 4:00-7:00 p.m. at the Paradise Community Center, 4775 McLeod Drive, Las Vegas, Nevada.

Why: Discussion of surface transportation issues and problems in the I-515 Corridor.

Where You Come In: Members of the public are invited to attend the meeting any time during the meeting hours and submit comments in writing or in person to a stenographer. An open forum format without a formal presentation will be used to increase the opportunity for public comment and provide for one-on-one discussion with staff members involved with the project.
