(Continued from Page 11) many times and has been used to-justify our economic position by suggesting that we are not "entrepreneurial" and other ridiculous myths promulgated by the establishment. I suggest you read Dr. Juliet E. K. Walker's "The History of Black Business In America," and Dr. John Sibley Butler's "Entrepreneurship and Self-Help Among Black Americans" to get the real reasons for our being behind in business ownership. Additionally, this is not about other groups and what they have accomplished. This is about us, Black folks; and it's about what we must do for ourselves to create a firm economic base for our children.

So what should our goal be? Let's look at this thing on a local level rather than on a national level. In cities such as Detroit, where the Black population far exceeds 50 percent and, unfortunately, the economies in most of the Black neighborhoods are controlled by East Indians and Chaldeans, Koreans, and everyone except Blacks, we should have a goal to increase our percentage of business ownership. In cities such as Atlanta, where Blacks control most of the politics, how about establishing a goal to control more of the economics as well? In Memphis, Tenn.; Richmond, Va.; Winston-Salem, N.C.; Jackson, Miss.; Birmingham, Ala.; and I am not about to leave out Cincinnati, Ohio; why don't we establish an economic goal, to control a certain percentage of our dollars?

Since we comprise 13 percent of the nation's population and only spend 5 percent to 7 percent of our annual income with Black businesses, we should see the value and the need to make significant changes in the way we do business. We should work locally by setting a goal, based on our percentage of population, to increase our spending with Black businesses.

In those cities where we are in the majority, let's do even better by not settling for "minority" status and being relegated to the smaller percentages of economic benefits derived from public development projects. In cities where we have smaller percentages, such as Portland, Ore.; San Diego, Calif.; Seattle, Wash.; and Los Angeles, let's work even closer together to increase our spending with one another and to increase business development and growth.

Let's set goals on a local level to capture, control and retain, at a minimum, a relative share of our dollars and a greater portion of our local economies. How? Make it a point to switch from the products you are currently purchasing to those products made by Black people; many are distributed via the MATAH Network, if you didn't already know that. Insist on, and be prepared to fight for, equitable distribution of public funds and projects. Stop allowing others to set "goals" for Black

people under the guise of 'minority programs.' Set your own economic goals and work toward them everyday.

what's required if America is to thrive in the 21st century global economy — when children born in Birmingham and Peoria will be competing with children born in Budapest and Beijing and Paris for the jobs that makes the world go.

We will support Black America's affirmation that it, too, has much more work to do to build an "empowerment movement" in education — a movement which by closing the dangerous, debilitating equality gap, gives African-American children a chance to contribute to America's growth and face the world on their own terms.


