PASADENA, Calif. (AP) - Neo-soul duo Floetry, rapper Missy "Misdemeanor" Elliot and R&B newcomer Heather Headley took home the most awards at the 2003 Soul Train Lady of Soul Awards.

Floetry was honored for best single by a group, "Say Yes," and best album by a

Elliott won twice, in best song of the year and best music video for the raunchy "Work It."

Headley's "He Is" won her honors as best new solo artist, and her album "This is Who I Am" was named the best solo effort of the year.

Other winners included Dorinda Clark-Cole for best gospel album and Erykah

group for "Floetic," as well Badu for solo single with "Love of my Life."

Whitney Houston confronts police

ALPHARETTA, Ga. - Whitney Houston angrily confronted officers as her husband, Bobby Brown, was arrested outside a seatood restaurant, police said.

Brown has been in jail since his Friday night arrest for violating his probation from an earlier drunk driving conviction.

The R&B singer is scheduled for his first court appearance Wednesday.

"She was outwardly frustrated. She was upset. She was yelling and screaming and pointing fingers at one of our officers," Sgt. Chris Lagerbloom said of Houston.

"We deal with emotions like that from family members all the time. To say that

she was calm about it would be a misstatement."

But he said officers didn't consider charging the 40-year-old singer with disorderly conduct.

Meanwhile, Brown "was as calm and cordial and professional as you could be," Lagerbloom said.

Brown, 33, was arrested because be apparently didn't show up for court-ordered community service, drug treatment or a random drug test.

He was arrested after being spotted at a suburban Atlanta restaurant with Houston. Another patron at the restaurant saw Brown and called police.
