4. Ready yourself for child search and placement



5. Receive Child Family Support Services.

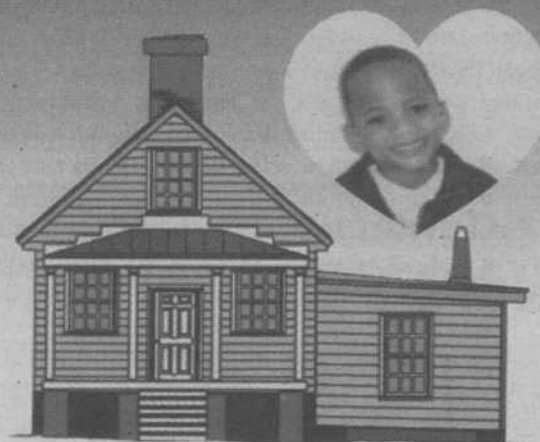
