Film journeys through of trauma child abuse

In a year marked by a string of cringe-inducing blaxploitation flicks like "Soul Plane," "The Cookout" and "Barbershop 2," it's nice to find a refreshing alternative to all those insulting modern minstrel shows which appear to have become standard African-American-oriented fare.

Adapted from the play based on the bestseller of the same name by nationally syndicated televangelist Bishop T.D. Jakes, "Woman, Thou Art Loosed" is a moving melodrama of tragedy, survival, faith and redemption. It retraces the unfortunate sequence of events that led a victim of child molestation down a self-destructive path leading to death row.

Kimberly Elise delivers an Oscar-quality performance in the lead role as Michelle, a fictional character author Jakes cobbled from countless souls whose stories remain untold. And the Bishop ably co-stars as a concerned minister who counsels and consoles the condemned woman. The principal cast also includes Clifton Powell

as Reggie, the pedophile who violates Michelle at the tender age of 12. Loretta Devine is a mother with a self-esteem too low to protect her daughter from the abusive predator.

Veteran director Michael Schultz (Krush Groove) shot the picture amid the grinding poverty of L.A.'s ghetto. His super-realistic cinematography makes no attempts to sanitize the hood. As a consequence, the harsh backdrop serves to compound the sense of misery conveyed by the harrowing plight of the haunted, ill-fated heroine as she turns to drugs and prostitution out of sense of despair.

Never hitting a false note, the saga unfolds as a series of flashbacks, not only from Michelle's perspective, but also from that of others who knew her intimately. These varied reflections enable the audience to reassess the convicted murderer in a new light, and rather sympathetically, given the factors which had contributed to her inexorable fall from grace.

cizing Republican efforts to woo black voters.

The Kerry campaign said Jackson, who will serve as a senior adviser, will travel to battleground states to energize Democratic support for Kerry and running mate John Edwards.


Meanwhile, Alphonso Jackson, the Housing and Urban Development secretary for the Bush administration, charged today that Jackson and other Black political leaders spread a message of victimization that leads most Blacks to vote Democratic.

The HUD secretary said he has advised President Bush's campaign to focus its efforts on younger Blacks who did not grow up during the civil rights era because older Blacks who did "have been conditioned" to vote Democratic by Jackson, NAACP Chairman Julian Bond, NAACP President Kweisi Mfume and others.

"They have made a living telling Black people they are victims," the HUD secretary, who like Jackson is Black, said in an interview with The Associated Press.

The HUD secretary, who said he has been consulting with Bush strategist Karl Rove and other campaign officials, said Republicans are targeting Blacks who are under 40 with a message that Bush's economic policies are better for them.
