Mugabe claims efforts to oust him come from White landowners in the country who want to rule the country again and make its Black citizens serfs. The United States, Britain and other European powers have put Zimbabwe on their human rights watch lists. Zimbabwe's leaders say that the Bush administration has little interest in their country or sub-Saharan Africa, and maintain that Rice would continue the U.S.'s lack of concern.

Mudenge noted that democratic elections in the country are scheduled for 2008, and the opposition parties are participating fully in the process.

Sen. Barack Obama (D-Ill.) asked Rice about the Bush administration's concern for some countries and lack of regard for others. Obama cited the civil war

and genocide in the Sudan as an example, noting that the administration has given little attention to the conflict.

"It is very difficult to have a specific definition of when you use force and when you do not," Rice explained.

Rice did not talk about Africa and its problems during her hearing, and was not asked about the continent except for Obama's inquiry. Throughout her career as national security adviser, Rice, an avid Europeanist who speaks Russian, has pushed for African countries to practice democracy and has pushed Bush to increase foreign aid as well as support for programs to fight HIV and AIDS. Rice accompanied Bush on his Africa tour in 2003. He did not visit Zimbabwe on that tour.
