(Continued from Page 7) Tomlinson's, shows that the American public feels we are a fair and objective source of news and information."

In a speech to a media conference in St. Louis on May 15, Moyers compared Tomlinson to Richard Nixon, who tried to cut funding to public broadcasting in the early 1970s because he perceived its news as unfair.

"I always knew Nixon

would be back," Moyers said. "I just didn't know that this time he would ask to be chairman of the Corporation for Public Broadcasting."

The CBP did not renew the contract of its chief executive, Kathleen Cox, in April. Tomlinson has tapped as her temporary replacement Ken Ferree, a former top aide to Michael Powell at the Federal Communications Commission.

NPR, founded in 1970, produces and distributes non-commercial news, talk, and entertainment programming around the nation. A privately supported, not-for-profit membership organization, NPR has an audience of 23 million American listeners each week. PBS, founded in 1967, is available to 99 percent of American homes with televisions and serves nearly 100 million people each

week. Together, NPR and PBS, along with their affiliates, will receive \$387 million in federal funds this year. Public broadcasting supporters are mystified by moves to monitor programming.

Ironically, the Public Broadcasting Act that established the CPB by an act of Congress in 1967, states that the CPB was created, in part, "to facilitate the development

of public telecommunications and to afford maximum protection from extraneous interference and control."

Wilson says he realizes that some might fear censorship of public television programs. "I know those concerns are there. The board is certainly bending over backwards not to be committed to any kind of censorship. That I don't think is going to happen."

PUBLIC HEARING AND COMMENT PERIOD
PROPOSED TRANSPORTATION PLAN
CONFORMITY ANALYSIS

The Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada (RTC), the designated Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Las Vegas Urban area, is proposing to issue a Finding of Air Quality Conformity for the 2004-2025 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP).

The RTP and an amendment (Amendment #1) were adopted in 2003 and a Finding of Air Quality Conformity on the plan was accepted by the US Department of Transportation in 2004. A new Finding of Conformity is required, because most of Clark County has now been designated by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as a non-attainment area for Ozone. A conformity analysis was conducted based on the projects listed in the 2004-2025 RTP and its first amendment. These documents can be viewed at the RTC Administrative Building or online at the addresses below.

This analysis demonstrates that the projects included in the RTP will not have a negative impact on air quality and that the 2004-2025 RTP is in conformity for Ozone and remains in conformity for Carbon Monoxide and PM₁₀ (particulate matter 10 microns or less).
