**Baldomir could test** world's best boxer

NEW YORK (AP) Carlos Baldomir gets his chance at undefeated Floyd Mayweather Jr., generally considered the world's best pound-for-pound boxer, for the WBC welterweight title.

They're scheduled to fight Nov. 4 at Mandalay Casino in Las Vegas.

Baldomir (43-9-6, with 13 knockouts) hasn't lost a fight in nearly 10 years. He upset Zab Judah in a 12-round decision for the WBC title last January and stopped Arturo fight of my career," the 28-Gatti in the ninth round on July 22. The 35-year-old Argentine called out Mayweather moments after defeating Gatti.

"Nobody ever thought I would win those two fights, said Baldomir through an interpreter at press conference Wednesday in Manhattan. "I don't talk much, but I do fight a lot. And I'll beat

Mayweather, too." Mayweather (36-0, with 25 KOs) won the IBF wel-


terweight belt in his last fight with a unanimous decision over Zab Judah in April, but relinquished that title.

"This will be the toughest year-old Mayweather said. "But I have fought at many different weights and won so many title fights, that I am always prepared.

"I'm predicting, right now, that I will go toe-to-toe against Baldomir and box circles around him. The boxing world better get used to me because I'm going to be around a long time.'

Promoter Dan Goossen said, "Carlos is a naturalborn welterweight ... big and strong. Mayweather started out at 130 pounds and had to build himself up (to 147 pounds)."

## **Barkley serious** about governor

PHOENIX (AP) - Charles Barkley insists he's serious ranging interview with reabout running for governor of Alabama, but he has to move back there first.

He also said he is an independent, not a Democrat as previously reported.

"The Republicans are full of it," Barkley said. "The Democrats are a little less full of it."

Asked if he had ever been in the governor's office in Montgomery, Barkley said no

"They don't let many Black people in the governor's mansion in Alabama," he said, "unless they're cleaning."

The quip came in a wideporters at US Airways Center, leading up to his induction into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass. Barkley, 43, retired in 2000 after 16 seasons in the NBA. He made the All-Star team 11 times and is one of only four players with 20,000 points, 10,000 rebounds and 4,000 assists.




