

MySpace to host concerts for Sudan

NEW YORK (AP) - The online youthful hangout MySpace.com will organize 20 concerts featuring bands promoted on its site as part of a campaign to raise awareness and money for humanitarian relief in Sudan.

The site, which grew in popularity thanks to its early adoption by emerging bands and their fans, has in recent months taken a more active role in promoting social

causes, such as environmental awareness and voter registration.

"The crisis in Darfur is a global concern, and as a global community, we have a responsibility to take action," Chris DeWolfe, MySpace's chief executive, said in a statement.

"MySpace's reach gives us an extraordinary opportunity to spread the word and empower individuals to help

address the horrors in Darfur."

Some 2.5 million people have been made homeless by three years of fighting between the Sudanese government and rebel groups in the vast, arid Darfur region of western Sudan. At least another 200,000 people have been killed since hostilities erupted.

Just last week, U.N. Secretary-General Kofi Annan

warned that Darfur is creeping ever closer to catastrophe, with rape and violence on the rise and humanitarian access at its lowest level since 2004.

The concerts will take place Oct. 21. Artists include TV on the Radio in Philadelphia, Alice in Chains in Winston-Salem, N.C., Ziggy Marley in Medford, Ore., Citizen Cope in Seattle, Gov't Mule in Spokane, Wash., and Insane Clown Posse in St. Petersburg, Fla. Other concerts will take

place in Sacramento, San Diego and San Francisco, Calif.; Melbourne, Fla.; Atlanta; Louisville, Ky.; St. Paul, Minn.; Reno, Nev.; Baltimore; Asheville, N.C.; Charleston, S.C.; Milwaukee; and Washington, D.C. A Canadian show will take place in Toronto.

Bands — pop, rock, country and reggae, among others — agreed to donate part of their ticket proceeds to Oxfam's relief efforts in Sudan and neighboring Chad.

(Continued from Page 16) would make him a sure winner for the Baseball Hall of Fame. It would be, his many fans all thought, a fitting tribute to the entire body of his life's work.

But 16 men and one woman were voted in and O'Neil was left out, one vote short of the required three-fourths.

Several hundred of his friends and admirers had gathered at the Negro Leagues Museum for what they thought would be a celebration.

Instead, they stood in awkward, restless silence as the old man once again — (for how many times in his long, eventful life?) — brushed bitterness aside.

"Shed no tears for Buck," he told them. "I couldn't attend Sarasota High School. That hurt. I couldn't attend the University of Florida. That hurt.

"But not going into the Hall of Fame, that ain't going to hurt me that much, no. Before, I wouldn't even have a chance. But this time I had that chance.

"Just keep loving old Buck."

But among his close friends, few believed that his heart wasn't really broken.

In the months that fol-

lowed, O'Neil embarked on an exhausting schedule that had him flying to California, Ohio, Arizona and New York among other stops.

He spoke at the induction ceremonies in Cooperstown. In July, he batted in the top and bottom of the first inning of the Northern League All-Star game.
