and old. There was a powerful surge of energy that swarmed the arena of fascinated fans, filling it with pure pride and exhilaration.

While it was rather easy to read the emotions of the thousands of supportive fans, it was much more difficult to decipher the emotions of Anthony.

When asked what he felt when his collegiate jersey was unveiled, he stated: "I was overcome with emotion. I felt so honored to be standing there, witnessing what the City of Las Vegas thinks of me. But again, this retirement ceremony is not about celebrating my collegiate success. We were a great team. No matter how great an individual [athlete] is, he or she always needs his or her team. I do, however, admit that tonight's honors are ultimate and overwhelming. A kid from Rancho High School was not only able to play the game of basketball on a collegiate level but was also able to win a championship there."

Other former UNLV basketball players also attended

the event, which took place to honor Anthony's importance to UNLV sports history. There were a few of Anthony's former teammates, current Runnin' Rebels, and many pre-Thomas & Mack Center predecessors that came out to support Anthony.

"Many made this day possible for me," he said. I want to thank my coach at UNLV, Jerry Tarkanian; his record speaks for itself. And my Rancho High School coach, Jim Allen, for not allowing me to make the mistakes that many of my predecessors made."

With the retiring of his jersey, Anthony joins the ranks of collegiate athletic greatness.

His jersey will hang freely in the rafters amongst those of Ricky Sobers No. 40, Reggie Theus No. 23, Glen Gondrezick No. 25, Stacey Augmon No. 32, Larry Johnson No. 4, and Sidney Green No. 21.

Not only did Anthony help his Runnin' Rebels team capture a 1990 NCAA Championship title, he managed to build an extensive

résumé in the process. He is a member of the 1,000-point scoring club, scoring 1,301 points in his collegiate career.

He also holds the record for career steals and assists.

He was drafted to the NBA by the New York Knicks as a first round pick in 1991, and he was inducted into the UNLV Athletic Hall of Fame in 2002. And Tuesday night

he joined an elite group of men that will remain etched in UNLV history for their athletic prowess.

"I'll always be a Runnin'

Rebel!," he proclaimed. "Always! And being from Las Vegas makes this day that much more of an honor to me."

NOTIFICATION OF INTENT TO ISSUE REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL(S) CITIZEN'S AREA TRANSIT (CAT) -FIXED ROUTE SERVICES OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE

The Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada (RTC) intends to issue two (2) Requests for Proposal (s) (RFP's) within the next twelve months for operations and maintenance for the CAT fixed route services provided by the RTC in Southern Nevada. The RTC's intent is to contract with a minimum of two (2) firms for fixed route operations and maintenance, who would operate from two (2) RTC owned transit facilities. The scope of services under each contract is expected to be relatively equivalent with regard to revenue vehicles and service hours.

The first RFP is expected to issue in February, 2007 for service to operate out of the RTC's existing facility in the northern portion of the Las Vegas Valley. Contract award is planned for September, 2007 with operations and maintenance service to commence on January 6, 2008.

A second RFP is planned to issue in the Fall of 2007, which will lead to the selection of a contractor to operate fixed route services from a newly constructed RTC maintenance facility in the southwest portion of the Las Vegas Valley, with operations commencing in early 2009.

punishment as he threw wild right hands that seldom found their mark.

Baldomir's frustration showed at the end of the fifth round when he gestured angrily at his opponent as Mayweather went back to his corner.

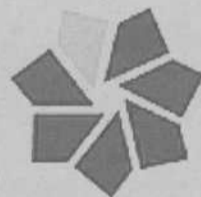
Mayweather earned \$8 million for the fight, while Baldomir was paid \$1.6 million.

"It's been a great year," Baldomir said. "I beat Judah and I beat Gatti. I went up against the pound for pound king. I accomplished a lot."

Mayweather fought without his trainer in the corner, though it didn't seem to matter much. His uncle, Roger, who usually trains him, was a Las Vegas jail serving a six-month sentence on a battery charge.

In another fight, Orlando Salido landed the harder punches and more of them to upset Robert Guerrero and win the IBF featherweight title by unanimous decision.

Salido, 126, of Mexico, won by wide margins on two ringside scorecards to take the title that Guerrero, of Gilroy, Calif., won in his last fight.
