Mother targets toy

An outraged mother descended like a one-woman army on a newly opened, dollar-type discount variety store, confronting the manager for allegedly selling pellet discharging, molded plastic, semiautomatic-looking, toy guns to minors.

Historic Westside neighborhood, Dianna Cooks complained to a local store after learning that her son and several other neighborhood kids, ranging from ages 9 to 14, were "waving the guns around while playing in her backyard tree house."

"I was angry and concerned that the guns could be

She continued, "I asked my son where he got the guns? I rounded them up and took them back to the store. There were five guns in all," she said. Cooks said the boys told her each gun cost \$1.

She demanded that the guns be removed from the store's shelves of the Save 99

A 60-year-old woman — a landlord, developer and three-year resident of her West Las Vegas community is accusing two White male Metro police officers of harassment when they stopped her near properties she owns alleging she was jaywalking next to a vacant lot, keeping her in a "spread eagle" position for 20 minutes on their police car hood, groping her in the pelvic and torso area during a body search, and issuing the senior a ticket for jaywalking.

Linda Goodman, said that in addition to the physical harassment while detained, the two officers hurled insults and tried to goad her into responding.

In an interview with the Sentinel-Voice, Goodman said, "I was walking across a vacant lot, between my two properties - a four-unit apartment building at Owens [Avenue] and H [Street], and the one family house at Van Buren and H — that was being renovated, at about 5 p.m. last Tuesday, [Feb. 20], when a police car speed down the street, and one of the two police officers yelled out, 'Hey you with the bandanna, come here."

Goodman said an unnamed police officer, wearing badge #9340, spoke to her: "Do you know you were jaywalking?"

She said she replied, "Where's the crosswalk?"

To which the officer replied: "If you weren't so stupid you would know the crosswalk is at the corner."

Goodman said, "The other cop then searched me." In what Goodman described as an "embarrassment,"
