The ceremony, which took place in a restaurantstyled ballroom, housed more than 200 guests. During the elaborate presentation, guests were served a three-course lunch that included soup, sea bass and soft shelled crab.

Cooking for and serving each guest, students involved in the culinary program showed their skills.

"I was very pleased with décor of the ballroom, the food, and the service," said Anne Rose, who attended the day's event.

"I know the students will be great at whatever they do. They've presented themselves well and they appear to be prepared to enter into their respective fields."

"Over the past 15 years,

the CTA has trained an estimated 25,000 students for entry-level positions with participating employers along the Las Vegas Strip," Horsford mentions while reading through his annual report and presentation entitled "An Appetite for Suc-

"This academy is one that will encompass many things. There will be a 600-seat community banquet room, a 120seat bistro-style training restaurant, custom hospitality training rooms, vocational English training courses for immigrant students, and investment/money management courses sponsored by Money Tree."

Chief Culinary Officer Sterling Burpee will essentially train each culinary arts student, preparing them for their roles in the culinary in-

"At the [CTA], you can enter as a fry cook or no cook and leave a sous chef. I've worked in Washington, D.C., New York City, and here in Las Vegas. I've been a chef for over 35 years, and it has been amazing to see the many changes in the culinary industry over the years. I'm teaching these students what I know, what I've been taught. And I see great promise in many of them. I know they'll do well.'

The academy enjoys an 85.2 percent placement rate with its graduates, ensuring a consistent stream of skilled hospitality workers to the participating employee partners. The academy trains students to be specialized chefs, housekeepers, bartenders, room attendants, just to name

"We not only hope to open up more jobs with the expansion of the academy, we want to give workers family-sustainable wages. This academy is not only about training but service to the community," Horsford said.

One way they'll assist the community, besides creating jobs, is through the Three Square program.

This program, in partnership with the Boys & Girls Club of Las Vegas, helps to feed the hungry, in an attempt to end hunger in southern Nevada.

Rappaport, who is also the president of the Luxor Hotel and Casino, said, "I can relate to these young people. I wanted to succeed in youth more than anything. I grew up with nothing, so I was determined to become something. In this business, as with many others, attitude is everything. These students want to succeed. And I believe them to be very employable."

"At any given time, there are 200 to 300 positions available at various Strip casinos. You can't find enough good people. If they're trained before they enter their respective field, they're

ahead of the game. This academy works hands-on with students to ensure success. They are ready when they leave our program. They are trained in state-of-the-art kitchens, by experienced trainers. This program is a true American success story. These students win because they gain careers and can go anywhere to work."

Horsford made it known that without the support of so many, this project could not have come to fruition.

"I want to thank so many. Without my wife, the community, the students, Congresswoman Shelly Berkley, Commissioner Lawrence Weekly, the Bank of Nevada, U.S. Senator Harry Reid, the 100 Black Men of Las Vegas, and SH Architecture and Urban Architecture & Design, this project would simply be an idea. We've accomplished something great here and cannot wait to view the inevitably pleasing outcome."
