## Black women take charge in city of Baltimore

BALTIMORE (NNPA) -Baltimore Mayor Sheila Dixon, City Council President Stephanie Rawlings-Blake and Comptroller Joan Pratt completed a historic political trifecta last week holding on to the top three seats in Baltimore City government.

Add Patricia Jessamy, Baltimore City State's Attorney and you have four Black women occupying the four most important offices in the city — perhaps an unprecedented scenario in American history.

"I think it's phenomenal, I think it's extraordinary," said Mayor Dixon during a phone interview as she traveled by automobile.

"When you look at the city council when I first came in," women were in the minority; African-Americans were in the minority," the mayor remembered.

"I think the citizens believe I'm doing a great job being fiscally responsible," said Pratt.

"I think I do the best job for the citizens, for the taxpayers," added Pratt who, like Dixon, is excited about the city's history-making leadership.

"It's a great day in Baltimore City. It feels great. I think women bring a different perspective to leadership," said Pratt, who as comptroller, actually oversees the municipal post office, municipal telephone exchange, the department of audits and the department of real estate.

"What I would like to see happen in this new administration is the department of real estate and the depart-

ment of housing work together to eradicate some of
these vacant houses," said
Pratt who, about to begin her
fourth term, isn't resting on
what is widely acknowledged as a highly accomplished career.

"What I would like to do is perform more financial and performance audits to be sure that the city does not expend more funds than it should," she said. Just a couple of days after her victory, Mayor Dixon is already signaling an urgency in city government that there will be more of an emphasis on accountability.

"We really have to look at city agencies. Either they have to step up their game or I'm going to have to clean house," said the mayor. "Some folks aren't going to like it, but we need accountability — no more handouts," said Dixon, who said she realizes that being the city's first woman mayor is an extra challenge for her as she governs a city bulging with challenges.

"You have to constantly prove yourself. But, you have to stay focused on the mission," she said. "It's [sexism] there, but you just try to be on top of your game."

Dixon said what she felt in her spirit and what she expressed verbally regarding

"I don't look at it like other people. I have to look at it spiritually," she said. "I was thinking how awesome God is to allow me to take on this awesome responsibility to direct the city to, hopefully, make significant changes."
