The federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reports that breast cancer is the second leading cause of death for all women (after lung cancer) and the leading cause of cancer death in women between the ages of 20 and 59. It is the most common cancer among women, excluding non-melanoma skin cancers.

Breast cancer is the most invasive cancer among women in the United States, accounting for nearly one out of every three cancers diagnosed. Every three minutes someone is diagnosed with breast cancer, and every 13 minutes a woman dies from the disease.

According to the American Cancer Society, about 1.3 million women will be diagnosed with breast cancer annually world wide, and about 465,000 will die from the disease annually.

The disease's most common risk factors are sex, age, personal history, family history and breast cancer genes.

Women are at the highest risk; risk increases as a woman grows older. Women who have had breast cancer and women with a history of breast disease may develop it again. The risk of developing breast cancer increases for a woman whose mother, sister, tion can often inform clients daughter or two or more relatives have had the disease.

On the positive side, earlier detection and better treatments have helped to steadily reduce breast cancer death rates since 1990.

"This same closedmouthness prevents us from obtaining adequate treatment and support. Because African-American women have a higher incidence of developing breast cancer and have a higher death rate attributed to the disease is the reason we need to speak out more."

When a doctor comes back with a diagnosis of cancer, she said many people shut down, unable to fathom the new reality of their lives.

"The medical community throws out a lot of technical terms that you can't possibly get your mind around," she said. "Our organization takes up where the doctors leave off, because we've been there. We have a personal interest and can be there emotionally where a medical provider cannot."

According to the Sisters Network Inc. website, the organization's national branding campaign, "Stop the Silence," speaks directly to the nation's African-American communities' long-standing history of not discussing cancer and other life-threatening health con-

"It is commonly believed that women should begin having mammograms at about age 40," she said. "Our organization teaches that African-American women should begin these exams 10 to 20 years earlier than this, particularly if there is a history of breast cancer in the family. Women should also request sonograms in addition to the mammograms."

Sisters Network Inc. reaches out to women by helping with completing insurance forms, assisting with family care, transportation, nutritional advice, assisting with the costs of mammograms, and a host of other support services and information sharing beyond

treatment of the disease itself that the medical community does not consider.

Beatty said, "Sometimes oping the disease at earlier a woman needs to know where she can get a ride to her treatment or someone to watch her children. Or she just may need to talk about her concerns, what's going to happen at her treatment sessions, or how she feels about her doctor. Doctors have no time to listen to a woman's concerns outside the medical treatment, or expertise in these matters. This is where we can step in."

Sisters Network Inc. is working hard to let citizens in the Las Vegas Valley know that there is help in the community for their concerns about breast cancer.

"It is important to know that you do not have to be rushed out of a doctor's office after you've been given a diagnosis of breast cancer or anything else," she said. "If there's anything you need to know about your condition or treatment, they are obligated to answer you."

Sisters Network Inc. wants the word out. By educating people, they hope to create an informational domino effect: one person will tell two; those two will tell four and so on. The end result, members hope, will be an educated populace that will take up the fight against at (702) 648-3410.
