(Continued from Page 1) portation failed to notify them of the project or give them opportunities to object before the first shovels hit the ground. NDOT maintains that residents were properly notified. Since the street's closure on Sept. 7, traffic has been re-routed to D Street. The F Street closure is part of a \$240 million project that will widen Interstate 15 from the Spaghetti Bowl interchange to Craig Road.

The City Council, which signed off on the project, has said that the closure resulted from a fatal moped accident and residential complaints about the proliferation of construction truck traffic.

Rev. Leon Smith said his church, the Pentecostal Temple Church of God in Christ, has been on F Street for 69 years.

"I operate a childcare center and it [the closure] has cut off the accessibility from Bonanza. It has really crippled some of the efforts of working mothers, parents

Former County Commissioner Matthew McAllister, who is a practicing attorney, filed a lawsuit on behalf of the residents and several civil rights groups to halt construction and re-open F Street.


