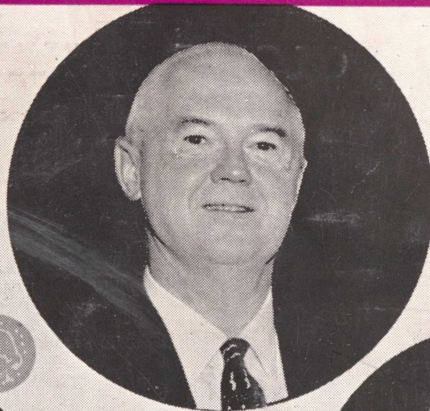
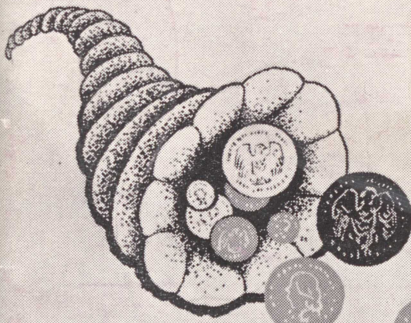

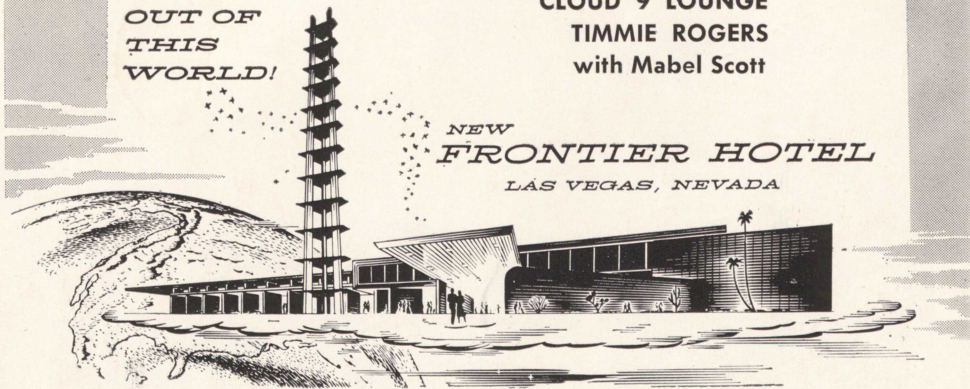

OBSERVATIONS

JUNE DAYS

WHAT A change half a century has brought to Las Vegas! My mind keeps yanking me back to the first June (1905) which Las Vegas enjoyed(?) after lots in Clark's Las Vegas Townsite were sold.

Our heated spell started on the fifteenth of May, the first day of the auction sale of lots and continued through July 14, two long and hard months for those who had invested their past, present and future in the infant Las Vegas. I remember as if it were only yesterday, how the sky clouded over that afternoon of July 14. As evening approached there was an ominous cloud to the southwest of us and a little later a curtain of dust through every crack.

Suddenly there was a lull in the furious blast and rain began to fall. All night it continued and Hotel Las Vegas (30 rooms with a canvas roof and walls) leaked like a sieve, the small streams of water with an uncanny instinct, seeking out the middle of each bed (most of them, thank goodness), vacant that night. I put in one of the hardest night's work of my life trying to save our bedding from the slimy flood.

Next morning the storm cleared up, but I remember that a few of us stood in the streets hoping the sulky sun would come out and warm things up, and wondering where we left our coats last May when summer weather began.

In June of 1905 Las Vegas took its first action as a community and I always remember it as the embryo of our Chamber of Commerce. Conditions were vile and almost unlivable. The big sixteen and twenty mule teams hauling freight to the mining camps of Rhyolite, Beatty, Goldfield and Tonopah, ground the earth into the finest dust and that dust floated constantly in the air. The hot winds drove it everywhere. There was no sewage

system and open vaults everywhere added their stench to the unpleasantness, and flies by the million were bred in the big corrals. They were not the ordinary flies buzzing lazily about, but savage, persistent and fearless breed of flies which were not afraid of anything but would stick to you until removed by force. I could endure the heat and dust and the vile smells, but those cursed flies almost drove me mad and Las Vegas would henceforth have had to get along without me but for the fact that I had invested the last dime we had in the new railroad town of Las Vegas, and it seemed that the only thing to do was to fight to the bitter end (which then did not seem far off).

I talked with a few of the remaining populace who were in the same fix as I was, about the possibility of doing something and we decided that if any of us were to live long, sanitary conditions must be bettered. So I wrote and posted a notice, inviting the public to a meeting at Hotel Las Vegas, to discuss our condition.

At the time of the meeting about everyone left in town was present. Of course there were a few pessimists who said there was no use making any regulations, because the county seat was at Pioche, 155 miles away and we, in Las Vegas, had no law to help us. However, we bravely asserted that if the people of Las Vegas would issue some regulations, we "The People" would enforce them. Quite frankly, we were thinking of "six guns" as our means of enforcement, but it never came to that. A committee, of which I was a member, drew up rather stringent regulations, and appointed a man named Fitzwilliams as our garbage collector and sewage system authoring him to collect for his services from each property owner the sum of one dollar a week. Much to our surprise there was very little opposition to enforcement of the regula-

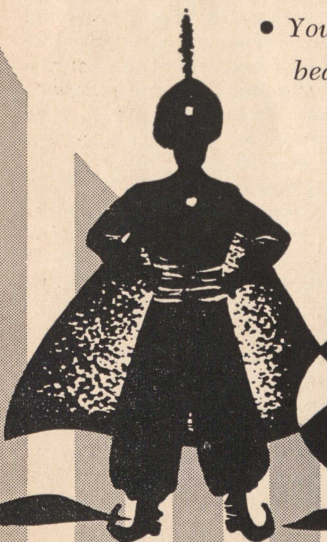

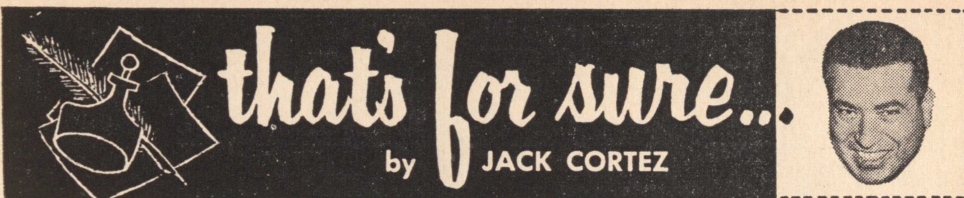

A HIS week's front cover salutes the Grand Opening of the SILVER PALACE. The Silver Palace's neon sign illuminates Fremont Street like a beacon in the night. Seventy feet of it spans the Fremont Street entrance and seventy feet of it extends over the First Street facade. The sign stands sixteen feet high and has drawn a great amount of comment, even though it is another addition to the "Glitter Gulch" of Fremont St. . . . Our sincerest congratulations to all affiliates of the SILVER PALACE. May Lady Luck fill their Horn O' Plenty with unending success. . . .

Although the JAKE FREEDMANS (of the SANDS HOTEL) had reservations to sail from Europe for their return to the states, they had to cancel out, in favor of the bird with the metal wings. Business is demanding a quick return of the "Little General" and they should be in FLV by the time this issue hits the stands. . . .

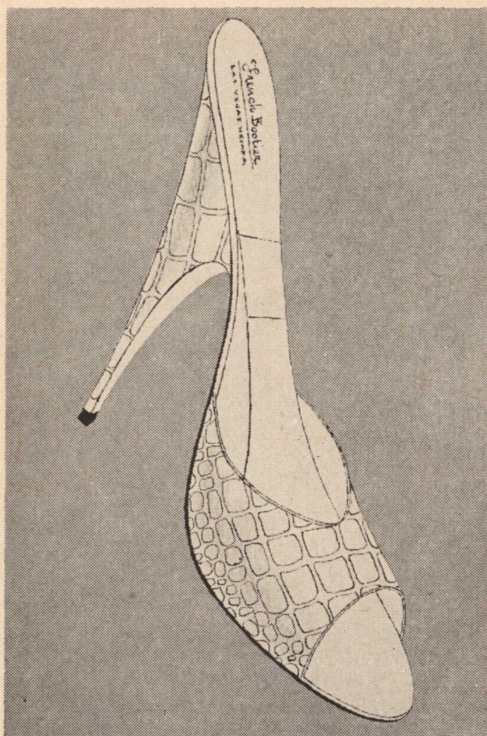

KEEPING THE title of MR. SEE AMERICA FIRST has been quite a chore but to date I do not think I have any serious contenders for it because in the past 18 months I have visited every state in the Union, every state in Mexico, every Province of Canada, Nassau, Bermuda, Cuba and Guatemala and the only places I have not been as yet were Alaska and Hawaii. The Secretary of the Navy is helping me see one of these latter two places in the form of the letter I am quoting below that just arrived. I shall go to Alaska over the Alcan Highway this fall before returning to the west, thus completing seeing everything in America. I had just gotten home to Minnesota from my extended tour of Mexico and was just getting my cottage in order for a whole summer of loafing and relaxing when, bang, comes this terrific invitation and so I am off again. Was hard to fly right through Las Vegas without stopping the other evening — did so want to get off the plane and take in the Helldorado but couldn't spare the time.

But here is the letter that is to take me half way around the world and back.

"Dear Mr. Hill: On behalf of the Secretary of the Navy, I take great pleasure in inviting you to participate in a cruise to Pearl Harbor aboard the cruiser USS Rochester, departing Long Beach, California, 29 May 1956. Return from Pearl Harbor will be via the air transport MARS, arriving San Francisco, California, the morning of June 13.

"You will spend about a week at Pearl Harbor visiting various naval installations in that area. The enclosed typical schedule of events will give you a general idea of the itinerary to be followed during your stay there, and the fact sheet entitled "About Your Trip as a Guest of the Navy," contains some useful information for your guidance.

"Guests are requested to board the ROCHESTER at Pier 1, U. S. Naval Shipyard, Long Beach, California, prior to 4 P. M. local time on Monday, 28 May.

"For the flight from Pearl Harbor to San Francisco aboard the MARS, BAGGAGE is limited to 65 lbs. per person.

"The purpose in extending invitations for cruises of this type is to better acquaint the public with its Navy, and to afford an opportunity for senior naval officers to meet and obtain the viewpoints of LEADING citizens.

"This cruise will enable you to see the Navy in action, and to note the high degree of technical development in modern naval weapons, which requires specialized training for both officers and men. You will have occasion, also, to observe that the operating forces are definitely cost conscious.

"To complete our records, it will be appreciated if you will fill out and return the enclosed biographical questionnaire.

"I hope you will find it possible to take this cruise, and that it will be convenient for you to let me have your decision by 3 May. In the event of a favorable reply, you will be provided with travel authorization papers for your trip.

tion and conditions in the little town became much more livable.

Perhaps that may be considered the beginning of our fight for a sewer system which, was not realized until after the incorporation of Las Vegas in 1912 or 1913.

Since I carelessly wrote "JUNE DAYS" as the subject of this column, I suppose I should try to stick to my subject. June covers only 30 days at the beginning of summer, but the great number of June brides is proof that June has had a marked influence on our lives. No, Dalphine was not a "June Bride," although I must admit and declare that it was not my fault. She came west from Austin, Minnesota and joined her parents in Seattle, Washington, in June of 1889, just after the great fire which destroyed the whole business section of the city. She had joined the staff of the Seattle public schools as teacher of music.

The harrowing tales or conditions in the devastated city of Seattle, gave me cause for much worry so I determined to rescue her. I left our home in Redlands, California, went to San Francisco on the fine old steamer Santa Rosa, and thence to Seattle by the steamship Walla Walla.

I found the city trying to regain its life by doing business in tents. Even the First National Bank, in which one of our old friends, Nordahl Solner, was employed. It took me several days of diligent search to find the Anderson family, but I finally learned that I had been searching in the vicinity of Lake Union, instead of Lake Washington, where the Andersons lived.

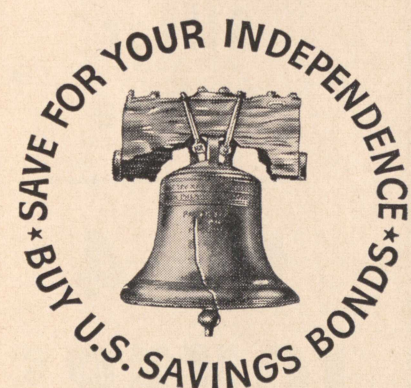
Delphine and I were finally married August 21, 1889, and came home to Redlands by sea, stopping a few days enroute at The Palace Hotel in San Francisco. Other June days which I remember with particular pleasure include June of 1932 when I was a delegate to the Republican National Convention at Chicago and helped nominate my friend Herbert Hoover, as Republican nominee for reelection as President. My satisfaction was short lived as Hoover was defeated in November under the malicious "Smear Hoover" campaign conducted by

Charlie Michelson, a long-time Hoover hater.

Another very delightful June was that of 1946 when Delphine and I attended "June Week" at the U. S. Naval Academy at Annapolis when our friend Robert P. Gatewood graduated and the next day married Marilyn Wengert in the famous John Paul Jones chapel on the Academy grounds.

June of 1948 also was a pleasant time for me as I was a passenger, with Rex Bell in a twin engined Beechcraft plane with seats for five passengers, to the Republican National Convention where we helped nominate Governor Dewey for President (who also went down before the onslaughts of "Give-em Hell" Truman. But I had the pleasure of sitting in the co-pilot's seat beside the pilot, "Connie" while we made a really perilous forced landing on an unimproved landing strip at Big Springs, Texas.

This year my political pleasure and satisfaction came May 18 and 19, when I attended the Republican State Convention and helped nominate our friend, Ed Converse, as Republican National Committeeman from Nevada, and was very kindly named as one of the Nevada delegation to the Republican Convention to be held in San Francisco beginning August 20, where of course I hope to help a little in the nomination of "Ike" as a candidate for reelection in November.

fanatical about his abilities as a playwright. Often, we left a theatre, following a performance of a Saroyan dramatic saga, quite limp with indecision of opinion. Saroyan's people were all there, alive and barking and mostly real, but they were thrust in such winding plots and loosely threaded theatricals that the play generally turned out devoid of pandemic appeal. One such histrionic evening still lingers in our memory. Sometime in 1941, Saroyan, fresh with the flush of being a hotly talked of influence in the theatre, penned one called, "Love's Old Sweet Song." Walter Huston headed a fine cast. Ten minutes after the final curtain descended, we had no idea what the play had been about or what salient points the writer had made. On the night of our meeting, we asked Bill, point blank, to explain, at this late date, the very hidden meaning of said play. He termed it as "a Californian's exuberance." He denied that it nurtured anti-labor inferences and he declaimed forcefully that it was not his purpose to write a reverse "Grapes of Wrath." He wasn't astonished to learn that our cult of theatre-going friends in that period did not digest his dramatic dissertation. He admitted there were at least nine interpretations of his theme.

Mr. Saroyan, with his powerful thinking and tremendous talents as an observatory-human style, should busy himself again and write. He has very much to offer our times. Even though we could be numbered among the dissenters most of the time, Saroyan was a healthy exercise.

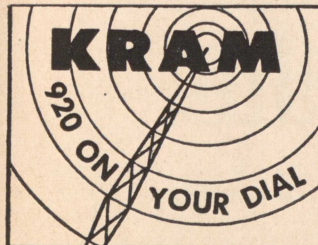

"possessive wife." In middle age, HE is "in the prime of life," or "at the peak of his career." At the same age, SHE'S "no spring chicken." If HE is an easy spender he "does not deny his family anything." If SHE doesn't count the pennies, she's "extravagant," or a "poor manager." Gray hair gives HIM a distinguished look. If SHE has it, she's an old hag. If HE hasn't any small talk, he's the "quiet type." If SHE hasn't any, she is "mousy." It all depends on one thing . . . whether you're speaking of a MAN . . . or a WOMAN!

Goethe once wrote this on "Perseverance": We must not hope to be mowers and to gather the ripe gold ears. . . . Unless we have first been sowers. . . . And watered the furrows with tears. It is not just as we take it. . . . This mystical world of ours. . . . Love's field will yield as we make it. . . . A harvest of thorns . . . or of flowers!
