
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

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

said: "Hello, Harley. Looks like snow."

"Oh, no. It never snows in Las Vegas," replied Harley.

I retorted, rather carelessly, "Bet you the drinks that it snows before five o'clock."

"You're on," retorted Harley, smiling with pleasant anticipation.

At five o'clock it was snowing merrily, with about an inch of the stuff already piled on the ground!

Of course we went to the emporium of Horden & Beale and with Harley "buying", and because it was cold and we needed it, I did a little buying, myself, too.

Every few days during the remainder of December it snowed a little more, so that on the north side of buildings there was what seemed a permanent ridge of ice and snow, making it a truly White Christmas that year. But things were to change before the end of the month.

On the morning of December 31 it turned warm and began to rain — a warm rain. The whole inter-mountain area was buried deep in snow, but we were glad to know that it would be melted and give things a chance to warm up.

That evening, snug under my umbrella, for which I had had no use heretofore and since moving to Las Vegas, I went to the depot to mail some letters on the east bound Los Angeles Limited. The train pulled out merrily in the warm rain — but with all its beauty and power, it never got

out of Nevada, but lay in a wash near Caliente for more than five months and was the last through train for five and a half months.

Our chief source of revenue had been the payroll of the railroad operating crews. One small train a day brought food to Las Vegas, but beyond the bare necessities of life, there was nothing to buy and nobody had money with which to buy. Our charitable organizations saw to it that no one went hungry, but it was a sad time for Las Vegas and her few people.

About 110 miles of our railroad had been destroyed and the Harriman Union Pacific crowd were loath to invest the large sum needed to rebuild on a "high line" grade out of the Meadow Valley wash where floods could not destroy it. Senator William A. Clark, Montana "Copper King", and from whom the Harriman crowd had practically stolen a fifty-one percent interest in the road by blocking construction during the famous "Right of Way War", finally came to the rescue of the railroad he had planned, financed and built.

I met the Senator while the work on the newly built "high line" was going on and walked up and down the platform while his private car was being serviced. I asked, "Senator, how is the high line coming on?"

"Charlie, it has cost me over six million dollars to rebuild that railroad," he replied with a worried expression.

There was happiness in Las Vegas when on June 15, 1910 the first through train eastward bound passed through



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

Las Vegas. It was a great and glorious feeling to realize that we were a going community again and we hoped and prayed that it would march on to greatness.

Las Vegas has more than kept her promise. And I am astonished that there are a few among the business men of our very prosperous community who seem to think that Las Vegas has reached her height. I have seen great cities grow from small towns, among them Ogden and Salt Lake City in Utah, and Denver in Colorado. Denver's early death was prophesied when the business center about the Taber Opera House was left behind in the march of events. "Denver would never have so great, wealthy and generous a friend as Taber," it was said. There was Phoenix, Arizona, too, which but thirty years ago was a comparatively small city clustered about the old capitol building, which for a while during the reign of Governor G. W. P. Hunt seemed to have lost its ambition. Closer to us are the great cities of California, and especially Los Angeles.

I came to Los Angeles in July of 1887, over the newly built Santa Fe railroad. Los Angeles was a comparatively small city of perhaps sixty or eighty thousand. The business section of the booming city was on Main Street between Temple Street and the Plaza. The beautiful Nadeau Hotel had just been built and every one agreed that it was a great credit to the city, but (there seems to be a "but" always in the minds of the gloomy ones) it would never be a success because it was so far away from the business district. That and adjoining property is now covered by about \$15 million dollars worth of buildings of the Los Angeles Times, the greatest newspaper in Los Angeles, a city now numbering more than two million population.

Perhaps Las Vegas will not reach vast proportions — or perhaps it will.

The combination of fog and smog is driving thousands of residents of Southern California to seek new homes in Las Vegas where the climate is the finest in the United States. Las Vegas will double in size probably during the next five years. Las Vegas has a vast reservoir of population to draw from, in addition, to the fifteen million in California. Nearly every person in the United States has heard of our wonderful climate, our liberal laws (which by the way do not encourage disorder and dishonesty, but quite the contrary), ample room for expansion as industrial plants come to us, and ample supplies of water and power. As a matter of fact, people are coming in faster than we can get ready for them.
