SEVEN STATE COMPACT

THE idea that a compact must be made among the seven states of the Colorado River Basin before any dam could be built, either by the federal government or any private agency, lay dormant in the minds of most of those people in that area until 1920. A few of us had thought that sometime an inter-state compact might be necessary, but we also thought that whenever the money and engineering skill were available a permit would be issued by the Department of the Interior and the dam would be built.

The long and vigorous campaign, which finally resulted in construction of the dam, lasted approximately ten years. To the men actively engaged in its development in Southern California

is due most of the credit for this great enterprise.

Los Angeles was growing rapidly and the wonderfully fertile Imperial Valley was being developed, but steps were needed to secure more water. The Colorado River was the only logical source of that water. So Los Angeles businessmen organized, in 1919, what they termed the "League of the Southwest" to promote sentiment in favor of a dam to be constructed along the Colorado.

A young fellow named Arnold Kruckman was hired as Secretary of the League. I made it my business to get acquainted with Arnold for I thought maybe he would boost for a dam in the Colorado near Las Vegas. I had other friends in Los Angeles at

that time including Bill Mulholland, Engineer of the Owens Valley Project; W. B. Mathews, former Los Angeles City Attorney then attorney for the Los Angeles Bureau of Water and Power; Lester L. Robinson, a member of the Board of the Los Angeles Bureau of Water and Power and others whom I hoped would work for the construction of the dam which, for more than ten years, I had already been helping to promote.

After a little talking it was decided that the League should call a convention to discuss the subject of Colorado River development and invite all of the leaders in politics and business that we could persuade to attend. The date of the convention was set for the first, second and third of April, 1920. The governors of the seven Colorado Basin States and those of Idaho, Montana and Washington were invited. Also a lot of prominent politicians, including William Jennings Bryan, and several well-known industrialists, including Sieberling, at that time a leader in the rubber tire industry. Delegates from all of the basin states were invited which, of course, included me.

I was anxious to have Nevada take a leading part and I wrote a letter to Governor Emmet D. Boyle asking him to attend the convention. I suppose it was a bit embarrassing for Emmet. He replied to my letter that he did not wish to commit the State of Nevada to such a visionary project, but that he would appoint me to attend as his personal representative and would back me up, within reason, as far as possible in anything I should do. As representatives of Las Vegas and Clark County I chose a small group who, at my request, Governor Boyle appointed to serve as delegates representing those two areas. These men included James Cashman, Sr., Dr. Roy W. Martin and E. W. Griffith.

The morning of April first the convention opened with about two thousand delegates in attendance. Numerous and eloquent speeches were delivered. At noon the Chairman appointed several committees. Governor D. W. Davis was named Chairman of the Committee on Resolutions and "Governor Squires of Nevada" was included

as a member on that committee. It was very embarrassing, but I was referred to as "Governor Squires" throughout the entire convention.

Our committee secured a committee room and sent out word that we would hear any and all suggestions with no idea in mind that any person would oppose our pet project. Most surprising was the fact that the only opposition came from the ladies representing the Los Angeles Women's Clubs who came in flocks and protested against the building of a dam in the Colorado River because they were sure it would inundate the Grand Canyon and destroy one of the world's most wonderful scenic attractions.

At the end of the second day of the convention, after all the testimony had been heard, Governor Davis asked for any resolutions to be presented to the convention. Nothing was forthcoming. After a few minutes of awkward delay, Governor Davis said, "I notice that 'Governor Squires' has been taking notes during our sessions, and I suggest that he be asked to prepare resolutions for approval of this committee by nine o'clock tomorrow morning."

I was happy to have this chance to write into the first paragraph, "a high dam in the Colorado River, at or near Boulder Canyon."

Next morning I had copies of that resolution in the hands of each member of the committee. A clause prepared by Governor Bamburger's Delegation from Utah was inserted. There was no objection heard and at noon, before final adjournment of this great convention, the resolution was adopted. It seemed to me that the dam was practically built for I little dreamed that we would have to continue the fight for another ten years.

The Nevada delegates were happy over the result and framed a cozy little banquet for William Jennings Bryan that evening. About one hundred and twenty-five were present. Bryan spoke, and his eloquence kept us wavering between laughter and tears for two or three hours. Perhaps Jim Cashman (I think he was there) still remembers it.

After the banquet I wrote a short account of the convention which the Los Angeles Times printed on its front page. I still have a copy of that paper

if anyone should wish to confirm what I have written in this column.

Just before adjournment the Chairman of the convention announced that the governors of the seven Colorado Basin States would meet in Denver on May 25th, 1920 to consider what further steps were necessary to induce the Government to build our dam. Again I wrote to Governor Boyle asking him to be present at that meeting. Again he declined and appointed me his personal representative. This time, however, he decided to also send the Nevada State Engineer to the meeting. That was where James G. Scrugham, who later became a Nevada Governor, then Representative in Congress and finally United States Senator, entered the picture. And I wish to say now, before I forget it, that he performed many valuable and helpful services for the State of Nevada.

Now I see that I have used my space in Fabulous without telling how that pesky "Seven State Compact" crept into what, up to that time, we considered rather successful efforts to promote a dam in the Colorado River. Next week I hope to tell about that fateful meeting in Denver and the issue that threatened to bog us down.




