THE WEEK of August 21
was full of anniversaries. It
spanned the 49th anniver-
sary of the wedding of Mr. and Mrs.
David Farnsworth; the 40th anniver-
sary of the Dr. Robert Gatewoods and
the birthdays of Mr. and Mrs. Charles
C. Boyer and Dr. Gatewood, and to
cap the climax, the 68th wedding an-
niversary of Delphine and me, who
were married in Seattle, August 21,
1889. We celebrated with a little din-
ner party as guests of the Tropicana
Hotel during which champagne was
served at the request of Robert P.
Gatewood of Washington, D. C., son
of Dr. and Mrs. Gatewood.

A beautiful cake with flaming
sparklers that had been baked for the

occasion by the Tropicana chef was
served and the dinner show with de-
lightful Carol Channing and the rest
of the entertainers was greatly en-
joyed by us all.

All of this, naturally, leads into
memories of 68 years ago. At that
time, I was living in Redlands, Cali-
fornia, at the home of my parents,
Dr. and Mrs. James P. Squires. When
we read in the newspapers that Seattle
had been destroyed by a great con-
flagration, I was greatly concerned
because Delphine and her parents had
recently moved to that city. I im-
mediately took passage on the beau-
tiful old steamer "Santa Rosa" which
departed from the mile-long pier at
Santa Monica Canyon, and was off

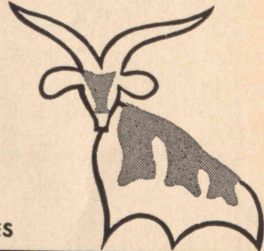

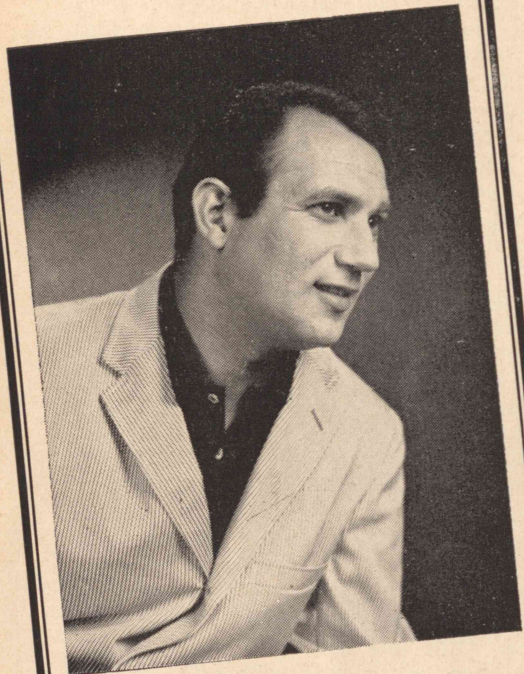

on my way to Seattle.

Steamship travel, in those days, was the favorite mode of public conveyance up and down the Pacific Coast, but conditions were quite different then from what they are today. The steamer left early in the afternoon and stopped at Santa Barbara, leaving there at ten P.M. and continuing on the journey to Port Harford along the way. At the port of San Louis Obispo, which we reached the next morning, we remained all day loading grain, which had been brought in from the many Central California valleys, to be delivered in San Francisco and from there shipped to far off places. The next morning we steamed through the Golden Gate and docked in San Francisco. From that point I boarded the "Walla Walla" that made the run to Seattle in three days.

Seattle was a sorry looking sight, but business was being carried on in tents. I had Delphine's address near Lake Union and searched that neighborhood thoroughly for the Anderson home, but could not find it. Then I had an idea that the family might live near Lake Washington instead of Lake Union, and so I walked up Yesler Way in a sea of mud as all of the cable cars had been put out of commission by the fire.

After a short search I found them all safe and sound. I had some difficulty in convincing Delphine that she should marry me right then and there, and go back with me to live in sunny Southern California, but she finally consented and we were married at Four O'Clock in the afternoon on August 21, 1889, and immediately took passage on the "Walla Walla" for San Francisco.

Our trip began with quite a lot of excitement when the ship, while trying to get out of the harbor crashed into floating debris left by the fire which stove a large hole in her bow necessitating keeping the pumps working all night in an attempt to keep water out of the hold. Mean-

while, steam derricks were busily engaged in shifting baggage to raise the bow higher out of the water. However, we arrived at Victoria the next morning where we spent the day. Victoria is such a beautiful Old English Type city with wonderful gardens in every yard. We left in the afternoon and passed through the strait of San Juan de Fuga into the foggy Pacific.

The journey to San Francisco took four days instead of the usual three, but we had a most enjoyable trip. We met two women on board who lived in San Bernardino, and we felt quite like neighbors as Redlands and San Bernardino were just ten miles apart. The eldest woman was the daughter of a very famous man, Jefferson Hunt, who acted as guide for the party of Mormons that passed through Las Vegas in 1852 on their way to settle San Bernardino.

At the dock in San Francisco, we took a hansom cab, with the driver sitting on top, and rode up Market street to the music of the old nag's hoofs clanking on the cobble stones. We turned left on Montgomery street and then through a great stone archway into the courtyard of the beautiful old eight story Palace Hotel which was surrounded by lace-like balconies and covered by a great glass roof. One of the wonders of this hotel, at that time, was the gas lighting system — the gas being ignited by an electric spark. We spent several delightful days visiting some of the interesting places and the theaters. One in particular we will never forget — seeing beautiful Julia Marlowe in the role of Juliet in "Romeo and Juliet" at the old Baldwin Theater.

The steamer "Santa Rosa" took us to the pier at Santa Monica and from there we took the Santa Fe for Redlands, our future home, where we were warmly welcomed by our family and friends.

All those things are pleasant memories to us, although tears came into our eyes when we read that the old Palace Hotel was destroyed by fire

following the earthquake in April 1906. Then the news of the wrecking and sinking of the "Walla Walla" and later the destruction of the "Santa Rosa" on the reefs of the Santa Barbara Islands also touched us deeply. Perhaps some of our old-timers will remember how these two boats were replaced by the "Yale" and "Harvard" between Los Angeles and San Francisco, but they in turn were later used to transport troops in World War I and both were sunk.

I don't think that there are any scheduled passenger steamers presently plying up and down the Pacific Coast, but in the old days it was the favorite route of travel for rest and relaxation. The ships were palatial; the food was wonderful and there was no hurry; no watching the road; and no danger of a collision — the last of which have all come with the automobile. I am not trying to cast any stones at our autos, but just at the unrest and confusion they have brought in their wake.

maitre d', manager and even bartender in a pinch, was a gem in answering the questions we put to him. And they were many. To dissect Jean's operation we must inform you that

his compact kitchen arrangement features four burners, assisted by foot pedals, cooks the food via compressed butane gas and has an added torch type burner, hand held by Jean (or does he prefer Pierre). Each burner is capable of reaching 2,700 degrees of heat. The food is quick cooked and we mean rapidement. In a sense, it is searing by stopwatch. No foolin', all dishes are prepared in a matter of seconds. We stood by as Jean Pierre (that covers it) handled filet mignon, medium rare, that is, in fifteen seconds. Every dish, and that includes the fifty to sixty shown on the hand printed menu, is prepared that way. Sauces, the secret of the seasoning, are concocted in advance. The only food that receives partial

pre-cooking is fowl.

The story (or is it legend now) has it that Jean started this kind of "torch and go" gastronomic gimmicking accidentally. Whatever the reason, the method is different and great for digestion, they say, and we chorus—"Tres delicious". Shrimp Diablo is our choice for an opener or Coquille St. Michel, a mixture of sea food and sherry, an excellent second. Duck is made five ways here. Our preference is Duck Tunisienne, which has peach and cherries to embellish the sauce. A real delight for the taste buds.

All in all, Lucky Pierre is a happy experience. You get to watch a flame game and eat sensational food. Call for reservations and tell Joe Reader we sent you.

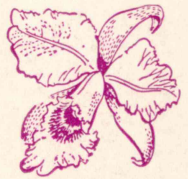
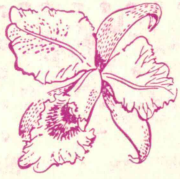
