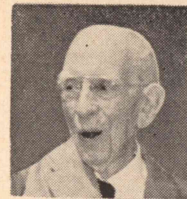

OBSERVATIONS

by CHARLES "POP" SQUIRES



THE POTOSI

WHEN I came to Nevada in 1905, the Potosi was a familiar name. In fact, it was one of the reasons why I was lured to Las Vegas. . . . I had been told by a distinguished engineer that there was a great mine near Las Vegas, which, when a railroad through Las Vegas furnished cheap transportation, would be very valuable. I learned also that this Potosi was named after a famous mine in Mexico from which the Spanish conquerors of that nation obtained much of the wealth which was sent back to Spain.

If you look toward the southwest from Vegas, you may see a flat-topped mountain south of the sandstone cliffs.

That is the Potosi Mountain, named after the mine of that name in Mexico. Early in my residence in Las Vegas I learned that the Potosi was owned by an old gentleman named Morgan, who had the U. S. Patent, signed by President Lincoln in 1863. Morgan had turned the property over to the Mahoney Brothers by a contract to sell. After some dickering my partner, Chris Brown and I, obtained the contract of sale from the Mahoney Brothers and we were really in the mining business.

That was before the days of motor trucks and costs were high, but we managed to make the operations pay for themselves. But I am getting

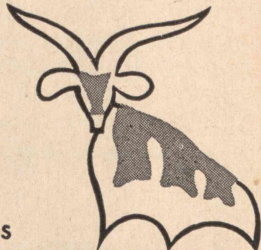

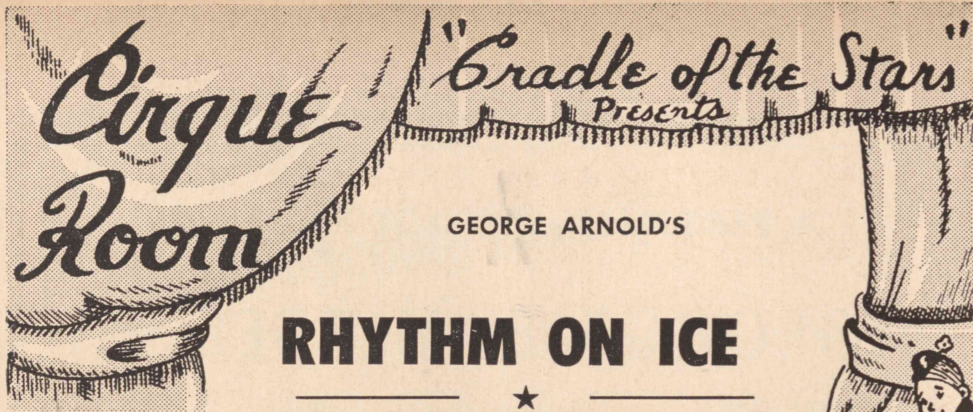

She is a great singer and was born in St. Paul. My good friend Mrs. Paul Bremer was introducing Mrs. Mary Takamatsu of Honolulu all around. Mrs. Bremer, with all her social, musical and financial background, hies herself off to Hawaii for many months each year simply because she loves the enchanting music of the islands.

Wallace Harmer, music librarian of St. Paul Public Library, had charge of the Viennese music for the party. Glen Jordan from City Center and NBC in New York staged The Great Waltz production and insists the St. Paul Civic Opera Association is as fine as any in the country. Joseph Maunn, President of St. Paulites Incorporated, spoke; and Walter V. Dorle, one of St. Paul's most substantial bankers, helped unveil an oil painting of himself that is the first of several planned paintings of past presidents of the Winter Carnival to be hung in this room. It has been renamed "The Kings Room" in honor of the Winter Carnival Kings. Vi Gould, beautiful singer of many past productions in St. Paul, escorted me around the room and introduced me to many that I didn't already know. Among them was the charming Mrs. Frank Bowman who is THE society leader of Minneapolis and the greatest backer the symphony and opera has in the Twin Cities. ahead of my story. I had learned that after Brigham Young had sent the 30 missionaries from Great Salt Lake in 1855 to found a mission of the church at a place somewhere on the desert to the southwest, called Las Vegas, he heard of the Potosi as a producer of lead, and instructed the missionaries to go there and get lead to send to Salt Lake City for smelting. The Potosi was found, and lead ore was brought to the old ranch where a small smelter had been made, and the ore was made into bricks, and some was sent to Salt Lake. In fact, lead seemed the principal object of the mission until, after a precarious existence of two or three years, the missionaries were recalled. The property seems to have had no history after the men left, until patented to Morgan. However, O. D. Gass, one time owner of the original Las Vegas Springs and Ranch, and Archibald Stewart, his successor, both knew of the Potosi Lead property, but nothing was done there until the Mahoney Brothers bought it from Morgan.

Chris Brown and I did very well with the property until the panic

struck us in October, 1907 and we could no longer carry the financial load.

The Empire Zinc Company, the big boy of the zinc business, took over the Potosi and began to operate it about 1911, and during the next four years made a profit of \$4,500,000, according to authentic information. After the Empire Co., ceased to operate the property, the mine was worked intermittently by leasers, but was finally closed down about 1920.

If you have had the patience to follow the story of the Potosi this far, please remember to pronounce the name Potosi with the accent on the last syllable instead of the second — Po - to (as toe) - si (as se) with the accent on the "se".

If this story has any reason for being retold, it is that for many years lead and zinc ores were the source of much of the financial life blood which kept Las Vegas alive during the long, hard, lean years when we were fighting for a means to prolong our town's existence. Until about

1923, we had little to do but dig ourselves out of the financial mud which many times threatened to engulf us.

If you are looking for a new and interesting bit of exploring without going too far afield, perhaps a day spent at the Potosi might fill the bill. Start early in the morning with a well packed lunch box. Drive out the highway to Pahrump Valley and you are on your way. Soon after passing the railroad station at Arden, you will come to the spectacular red sandstone cliffs rising several thousand feet above the valley. Soon after entering this mountainous area you may find, if interested, some very fine Indian picture writings, which were placed there by those vanished people who lived in the "Lost City" which is now covered by the waters of Lake Mead. One of the big rocks was of special interest to me more than fifty years ago when I used to stop there to rest the horses and eat lunch on one of many trips to the Potosi.

As you continue your journey watch for a wagon to the left up a

low mountain pass. Continue over this pass and you descend and soon arrive at the old Potosi camp.

I suppose all of the old buildings (there was quite a little village there) are gone. You are now ready for the hard work of your trip, the climb up to the mine, which is about eight hundred feet above the camp.

Fifty years ago there was a cable tram from the mine level down to the camp. This was used exclusively for ore that was placed in small cars which ran over a railroad leading from the mine around the mountain to the top of the tram.

Some fifty feet, perhaps, above the level of the trail was the opening into the great excavation. I assume, of course, that practically the whole mountain top was undermined by the work New Jersey Zinc Company did, but I have not been there since about 1910. There used to be quite a fine little forest of yellow pine covering the whole of that flat topped mountain.

The view toward the south over the Goodsprings country was quite extensive and awe inspiring. When you start for home, look for the opening of quite a deep cavern on your right, but don't try to explore it. I did that once and found it very difficult to get out of.

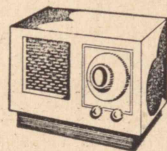

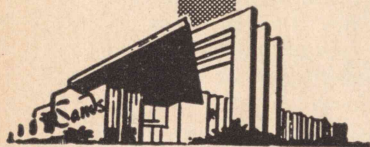
