

LAS VEGAS FIRST JUSTICE OF THE PEACE

MANY OF the early day inci-
dents of Las Vegas and the
people connected with them
fill a very special place in the minds
and hearts of our old time residents.
There were so many amusing things,
now almost forgotten, which a word
or a face will bring to mind. One
such incident came forcefully to mind
a few days ago when I read in the
local papers that "filings" were in or-
der for the next election, and again
when I heard the word "inquest."

These two words carried Delphine
and me back to the year 1905 when
the new town of Las Vegas had been
formed and we were busily engaged
in trying to find the right men to fill

the town offices. We finally found
men we thought competent to serve,
with one exception — the Justice of
the Peace post — which was to be
appointed by the District Attorney in
Pioche. For some reason that job did-
n't seem to be as popular in those
days as it is at the present time.

At last, word came from Judge
Saunders that he thought he had
found a man who possessed all the
qualifications necessary for the job of
Justice of the Peace. The gentleman
was reported to be courteous with a
strong sense of conviction between
right and wrong and the bodily
strength to carry out his decisions, if
need be.

We were quite happy that such a







WHILE LAS VEGAS has been sweltering in the heat I have been sitting up here in Minnesota at HILLSWAY ON ANN LAKE literally freezing to death. Last winter was the mildest ever on record, but I think this spring has broken all records for being cold and wet.

prospect had been found for it had been like hunting for a needle in a haystack, and we were still afraid that we would have to hog-tie him to make him accept. His main objection was that he could make more money shoeing horses than in dealing out justice. You see he was a blacksmith, and there were hundreds of horses in the corrals on the West Side which were being used in the freight business between Las Vegas, Goldfield and Tonopah. It was with thankful hearts that we finally got him to accept (I think it was the title of "Judge" that really did the trick.)

He was a German, named Jacob Ralph, and he used his blacksmith shop on First Street near Lewis as a court room. In the shop there was a tub which he kept full of water in which to temper his irons. The overflow formed a muddy pool on the dirt floor where his white Pekin ducks delighted to waddle and quack. While the judge was holding court it was difficult to distinguish between the voices of the witnesses and the ducks, and a visit to this court room was well worth while.

However, the ducks had nothing to do with the "flash" which came to mind at the mention of the word "inquest" — it was Judge Ralph. One day the body of a man was found in

the bushes beyond the creek and the Sheriff notified the Justice suggesting that the proper method of procedure in such cases was to call for an inquest. Our matter-of-fact Justice could see no reason for such a thing as an inquest: "An inquest? What is the need of an inquest? The man is dead ain't he?"

Another amusing incident comes to my mind in relation to Judge Ralph and his method of meting out justice. One day a man by the name of LaFrance was brought into court charged with disorderly conduct. During the course of the hearing, LaFrance answered the Judge in a most disrespectful manner and he immediately gave him a fine and jail sentence for contempt of court. The Sheriff started with the prisoner on the noon train for Pioche to place him in the county jail, but later in the afternoon, when the train reached Caliente, they were met by an officer with a writ of habeas corpus and the prisoner was released. It seems that a Justice of the Peace has no power to sentence a man for contempt of court.

Judge and Mrs. Ralph lived in a tent near the shop and the tent was a marvel of neatness to the women of Las Vegas. We wondered how it could be done. It was just a small, ordinary tent with no floor, but fresh hay was spread over it to keep down the dust. The bed had an immaculate white bedspread and "Pillow shams."
