

By **HARRY PARKER**



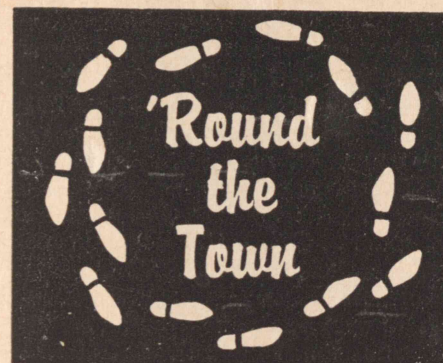

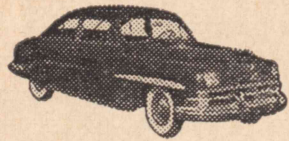

# Hillsway

**H** GUESS I must live right, because right up to Sunday morning it rained cats and dogs and then started again early Monday but left Sunday one of the most beautiful days imaginable for my Fourth Annual Open House and Garden Party here at Hillsway. Every year more and more come to this affair. Last year three hundred showed up and this year over five hundred came from as far away as Pittsburgh, New York, Denmark and California.

The world-famous DETROIT ALL-UNIVERSITY TAMBURITZANS — twenty-five strong — came from their northern Minnesota summer camp at Bemidi State Teachers College where they are rehearsing and getting in shape for a hard winter on tour and at school.

After their stint at the college they go on a four state tour, ending up back in Detroit where all matriculate at the local colleges and universities. They all have scholarships to continue their music and dancing studies and during their school vacations they tour like any college glee club or orchestra. They even play, sing and dance at Carnegie Hall in New York City. Originally they were in Pittsburgh, but the Governor of Michigan heard them perform at the Detroit Auditorium and literally took them away from Pennsylvania and lined them up for scholarships at Michigan.

Matt Gouze, known the world over as the Tamburitza King, leads, trains, and conducts this group and is a very likeable fellow with more pep than most men you meet and with more music in him than anyone else I have ever had the pleasure to know. Talk about being accommodating. He came

all the way here just to entertain for me and my guests — they had to drive some three hundred and fifty miles to do it.


Unfortunately they had bus trouble, and did not arrive in time for the dinner that I had arranged for them at the Ogilvie Catholic Church so they came right on out to the lake. They used my schoolhouse for dressing rooms and in a few minutes they were garbed in their colorful Slavic and Serbian costumes and ready to perform right on time at two o'clock, and remember none had eaten since early morning before leaving Bemidji!

First they strolled around the grounds like Phil Stern does with his singing violins, playing for groups here and there under the trees. Then the entire ensemble performed for two and a half hours on my specially-built platform stage on the lawn.

Miss Violet Gould, a good friend of mine, came up from St. Paul to sing a few numbers — she is the top soloist in the Twin Cities and literally captured the throng with her beautiful songs and style. She even composed and sang a song in honor of me about Hillsway and the open house.

Serbian, Slovenian, Yugoslavian even Russian numbers were on the program and the twenty-five sang numbers, danced both solo and in groups and all played instruments. This is one of the peppiest groups that I have ever seen outside of Europe and each member is a finished artist in his own field.

After the formal concert Matt asked for favorite numbers from the audience and no one could stump them on a single one. Then his continental ensemble played a sort of olio show afterwards — even playing many rock
