Just about thirteen years ago most of the world's population accepted as fact the demise of one of history's most infamous characters, Adolph Hitler. Circulating on the newsstands today in the form of a paper back edition by noted historian ALAN BULLOCK, is a piercing biography that makes for "thought producing" reading.

Mr. Bullock was not content to just present documentary facts in the life of Hitler, but chose as well to outline the rise and decline of his power, the motivations behind it and his resulting unsuccessful attempts to expand this influence around the globe. This is to date the most interesting and revealing books to have ever been compiled on the life and personality of this man, as great a single force for evil as the world has ever known.

# Hillsway

**D**ATELINE . . . COLORADO SPRINGS, COLORADO. . . As I write this I am looking out at majestic Pikes Peak with its cover of snow. This is my thirteenth annual Fall trip to Las Vegas from Minnesota, and each year I go a different way so as to hit a different part of the country every couple of years at least. Southern Minnesota was gorgeous in all its autumnal finery and the weather was perfect.

The first night I stopped at Sioux Falls, South Dakota. The MIDWEST OIL COMPANY of which I am vice president, owns a fine motel in Sioux Falls called the ACE HOTEL, so it was nice getting a free room and free gas. The president of the company, Howie Peckham, and his wife took me to dinner at the lovely TOWN & COUNTRY RESTAURANT and showed me the sights of the town. WILSON'S TOWN and COUNTRY is located on West Twelfth Street and is easily the top eating place in town. Many people like LEMOND'S RESTAURANT on South Phillips (I do too), but it has recently changed hands and I did not want to take a chance on it this trip. In the morning before leaving, I stopped at CHRIS' COUNTRY GRILL on East Tenth Street for a wonderful breakfast. This grill is situated alongside a large oil company and does not look like much until you get inside, but it certainly is a wonderful spot to eat.

Driving across Nebraska and Kansas at this time of the year is kind of dreary. Did enjoy a nice lunch at the YANCEY HOTEL in Grand Island. Stopped overnight at a new place to me this trip — the EMPIRE HOTEL in St. Francis, Kansas — and it was very adequate, fine and quite reasonable — only \$5.00.

Dinner at the BON TON RESTAURANT over in town was excellent and only cost a dollar and a quarter. I wonder how these small towns can do it? They serve the same food as places in bigger towns yet charge less than half the price.

The drive from St. Francis into Colorado Springs was a nightmare. It was snowing hard and much road work was being done. Places for five miles at a stretch were like driving on grease and I turned around several times. It was all the worse because there is a very decided grade uphill here. I don't know how smaller cars ever got through at all.

Colorado Springs is one of my favorite towns. I stayed at the ACACIA HOTEL and have decided to remain a few days because there is so much to see and do.

Yesterday I drove over to Denver which is about seventy miles along Highway 87, a new, four-lane divided road all the way. Stopped in to see the new AIR FORCE ACADEMY on the way. It is amazing to say the least. There is a network of roads leading to it, and how I ever got to

the top to the main building I will never know, as I just had to feel my way along.

The academy itself is a huge block of marble and glass, mostly glass, and it must be four blocks square. The entire ground floor is open with just pillars holding the building up. The cadets literally live in glass cages with the windows being of tinted plate glass. You certainly can see everything that goes on inside the building from the outside. The theatre and chapel haven't been built as yet, because there has been so much controversy about the style of architecture to be used. Frank Lloyd Wright couldn't have dreamed up a structure any more "different" than this one.

Denver is growing by leaps and bounds. The Mile High Building is a dream and stands on North Broadway where one of my favorite eating spots used to be — the BLUE PARROT — which I understand has gone under since it moved out on University Avenue into a lush new location.
