

And because **FORREST JOHN PURDY** was also the father of one of our closest friends, **MRS. GERALD PICO**, it hit with a shocking impact. BUD ABBOTT and LOU COSTELLO about seven years ago offered us a television series. But we had our mind set in other directions and foolishly didn't accept. "If and when you do do a series, we'll come on your show," they said. And they sent us a letter to that effect. That's the way they were.

Bud and Lou were the top comedians in the world. Their pictures made more money than any at their studio, Universal-International. They saved the studio at one time from possible bankruptcy. In fact, their pictures made over a hundred-and-fifty-million dollars and for Bud and Lou fifteen million.

Now the beloved Lou is gone, but he left his family well taken care of. But Bud, headlines recently said, is in dire financial circumstances. And you wonder why?

We called Bud to ask him. Millions of the Abbott and Costello fans are worried. We rang and Betty (Bud's wife) answered in a panic. "I can't talk — the whole back of our house is on fire. I've just called the fire department." Then with natural human curiosity, "Who is it?"

So we didn't ask Bud, but we did ask one of Bud's closest friends. And he said, "You know Bud and Lou, they came up the hard way. From no money they become millionaires, and they always had their hands in their pockets to help anyone who needed it. They didn't realize that with the tremendous taxes, they were actually working for the government. They could keep very little of their money.

They started a national campaign to help youth and to stamp out juvenile delinquency. They paid out hundreds of thousands of dollars to help boys and girls all over the world.

They instituted a foundation and then put in over a million dollars in the City of Los Angeles alone.

Four years ago Bud decided he was getting along and he wanted to retire. So he did. He had enough to live comfortably, and he said he didn't want more than a simple life from now on. He had worked hard — very hard for many years. His health couldn't match the pace. When Bud "was on" — like Lou — he "was on" all the way — paid performances and charity and benefits — he took them all along with Lou. But Bud Abbott discovered he can't retire and live a simple life. The government began going over the books. Taxes that he understood to be settled long ago were suddenly revaluated. The deductions that had been allowed were now re-figured.

Overnight he found himself selling this piece of property and that security to satisfy the back income tax. Now all Bud has left is his house. We hope that Bud still has his house after the fire. And we wonder further if all of the awards of merit, the many scrolls and trophies national and local heaped on Bud for his charity and efforts to help his fellowman were left intact by the fire.

Bud, remember, hasn't complained. But somewhere along the way — a man who has given so much to make other people happy — should it all, his little security be taken away from him?

Bud Abbott is a great performer, and he is a tremendous comedian. Let's hope that he comes back with a tremendous welcome in show business. His partner Lou is gone. He may carry on alone, but he's back.

Hope you welcome him when he plays Las Vegas.

SUMMER SERENADE: Congrats seem to be in order for James Cagney, who this year, or is it this month or maybe this week, celebrates his 30th year as a motion picture actor. His dynamics and high tension "thespianics" were always welcome screen offerings to this flicker follower. It was something Jimmy said to us a few years ago that sets him out from the crowd. Over a hurried sandwich the ebullient carrot top explained his own qualms in relationship to the making of a next picture. Said Cagney: "Regardless of how well your last movie was received, you must feel that there are people other than the studio boss and your agent who will want to see you in another film. As long as a performer thinks along those lines he'll be more concerned about getting a good script and in turn will lengthen his life before the camera." . . . The late Hy Turkin, of the sports staff of the Daily News, was a sweet, kind man who took sportswriting with all seriousness. He covered an event with the importance due an international story. One of the perennial list makers threatened to cause loss of sleep among the toupe manufacturers by releasing his selections of the most attractive bald plated men in the country. Somewhere we suspected a lurking desire to promote a new Yul Brynner picture.
