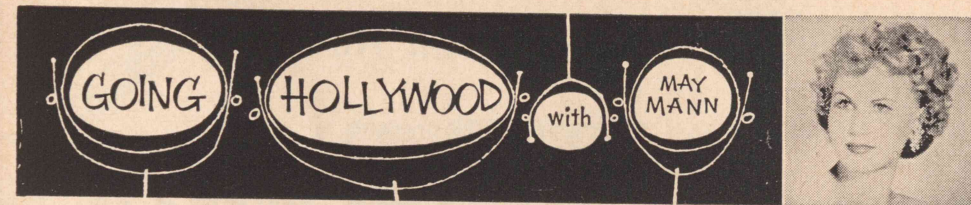
the video rounds. He blew up. Any repetition of his past problems with the constant ringing of the curious and the depraved will fire our gent to legal action.

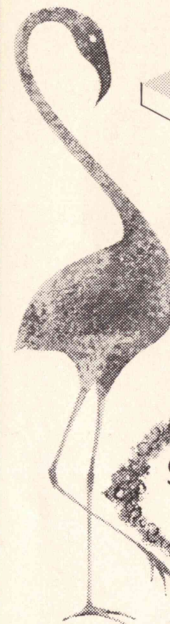
