HATELINE . . . Long Beach, California. . . . My columns of late have all emanated from far flung places of the world and have been mostly about strangers to our local scene in Las Vegas and now that I am back at my desk again I want to write about a couple of our good friends who are making good in far-flung places. Last night I had one of the most enjoyable evenings I have had in a long time. First of all you all remember Irene Wright who was Secretary and right-hand "man" to Gene Murphy for several years. Well Irene is now married again and living in Hollywood and I called her up and asked if she and her new hubby, George Lauderbeck, would like to go out to dinner with me and so the three of us betook ourselves out in the Valley to Sepulveda to the GILD-ED RAFTERS.

I was thunderstruck when we drove into this place at 8701 Sepulveda Boulevard and found it so spacious and gorgeous. Natty Nat Hart and his lovely wife, Sylvia, have personally decorated this place and have made it one of the show places of the west coast. It is simply terrific and almost defies description. I have seen what this pair has done with two different homes they literally "built" themselves in Las Vegas but never dreamed that they could take over a rambling old coffee shop and make it into this dream place way out in the val-

ley.

The outer doors are hand inlaid with various stones and a deep plush red carpet is on the steps. Inside there is a waiting room, fireplace to one side with glowing embers, fine seats and Italian cocktail tables. To the right is a gorgeous cocktail lounge with huge windows looking out onto fine fountains. A pianist furnishes music here at the piano bar. Nat personally served us cocktails and a huge plate of hot hors d'oeuvres. Then he ushered us into the main dining room which is a beauty to behold. Painted in soft greens, ankle deep carpets, and with soft lights and comfortable booth seats. And then the bacchanalian feast began — he calls it his Gourmet Dinner. Nat personally tossed the biggest salad I have ever had and it was scrumptious. When that course was finished our lovely waitress, Lucy Mignone, brought in a heaping plate of hot small shrimps — something on the order of Creole shrimps. Then came a course of Coq Au Vin Chicken. And of course with each course was a special kind of wine. coffee and liqueur. It is absolutely a sin to dine like this, but how we loved it.

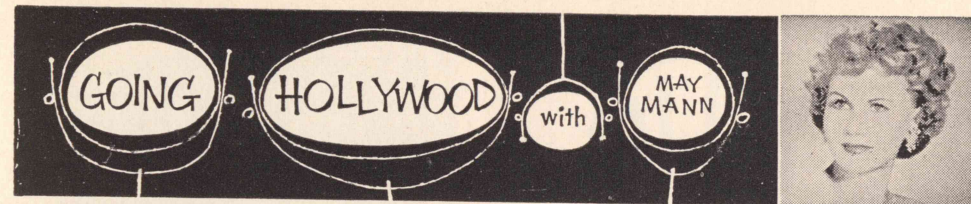
After dinner and talking with Nat and Sylvia and their charming daughter, we were ushered upstairs to the Golden Slipper Room where an entirely different atmosphere exists. Here were beautiful red wall-papered walls, huge antique stained glass chandeliers like mother used to have over her dining room table, red carpeting on the floors, gilded rafters in the ceiling and two wonderful men pianists performing at the pianos like Crazy Otto, and everyone was singing and having the time of their lives. The bar girls were dressed in abbreviated gay-nineties costumes and passed out noisemakers and paper hats and popcorn and peanuts, just like as if it were New Year's eve.

I simply cannot recommend the GILDED RAFTERS too highly, and of course you all know how suave and polished and debonair Natty Nat Hart is - well here in his own bailwick he

I don't often bet on a winner and after many starts and many mistakes I have finally hitched my wagon to a star that is going places in no uncertain terms. You will recall how last fall and long before that even I began beating the drums for my very good friend, Bill Briare. After heading every organization he belonged to for the past several years since he and his charming wife Jo moved to our town from San Francisco, Bill was last year elected to the State Assem-

I'M SPEECHLESS - but the first person I saw (whom I knew) who said "Hello" to me in Honolulu my first day - was Elvis Presley! I had meandered down Waikiki beach to Hawaiian Village where the Hal Wallis "Blue Hawaii" starring Elvis Presley, of course, was filming. A dozen policemen had the beach roped off where cameras and crew were at the surf line - while hundreds of people watched from a respectful if demanded distance. I smiled and walked into the forbidden territory - looking for the publicity man. Someone tall, dark and handsome in swim trunks looked around and said, "Well May, where did you come from?" It was Elvis.

Elvis posed for a picture with me - and standing there quite innocently - what happened? An unsuspected minor tidal wave (to me anyway) came up from behind and drenched me, dress, shoes, bag, hose and all! In fact if it hadn't been for Elvis grabbing me - I'd have been swept out to Honk Kong by now for sure! Everyone thought it was very funny! Was it?

Elvis Presley was never more handsome. His swim trunks revealed perfect proportions, a good tan - and fifty million fans will agree that he is the most appealing new star on the screen. In "Blue Heaven" Elvis plays a tourist guide - and he is backed up with some of the most beautiful girls ever cast in a picture. I saw 'em!!

The magic of Elvis' charm and

talent and Col. Parker's astute handling performs miracles. One was their offer to help Hawaii raise the money for the memorial for the U.S.S. Arizona which with its 1102 men entombed lies at the bottom of Pearl Harbor. Col. I checked into the beautiful Moana Hotel (which with its Banyan tree lighted in colors, and the flaming torches reflecting in the white caps washing the shore at its door) is the most charming and quaintly lovely hotel on the whole island. It has retained its old world charm without and while it is spacious inside, it is also modern - and heavenly. So I called Tom Diskin to let him know I had arrived and how was Elvis?" Col. Parker had returned to the mainland he said and he knew I was just going to love
