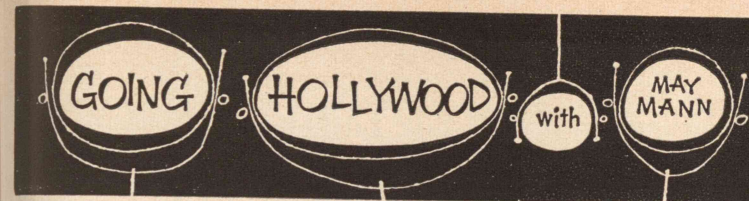
Mickie Finn, of NBC-TV's stable of stars, has inked a pact to appear at Caesar's Palace this Fall. . . . In case

LUV, you and I are going to do a little delving today to find out what "a certain phase" of acting is all about. Did you ever, like Fabian, apply to a drama class, and be told, "Be an apple!" Sean Flynn told me he went to a professional workshop and, "They told me, "Be a kangaroo! I didn't get the message, so I didn't go anymore." I must admit I've been confused, too, about this and "the method," and the "Stanislavsky system." So, happily, the other eve, an actor friend took me for a visit to the Professional Theater Workshop at Desilu Studios, which I believe was originated by the prexy of that place, Miss Lucille Ball.

Anyway, some sixty actors, writers, and directors are devoted there in a non-profit way, to stimulate the growth and creativity of their crafts. And on this memorable night, I found myself seated for a demonstration performance of the major principles of "The Method in the Method" — that has all to do with "Be An Apple," "Emotion Memory," "Physicalization," "Externals," "Tempo Rhythm," "Concentration," "Sense Memory," "Inner Truth," "Relaxation" and all the tools of an actor's trade.

The professional player's improvisations were keyed to action. And the running narration by Mr. Tony Barr was most enlightening on "The Method." I was immediately prompted to pass as much as possible of it on to you.

Said Mr. Barr in part: "Let me surprise you by pointing out that Stanislavsky is **not** an advocate of mumbling, stoop-shouldered acting dedicated to navel-gazing. In his own words, in order to express a most delicate and largely subconscious life, it is necessary to have control of an unusually responsive, excellently prepared vocal and physical apparatus.

That is why an actor of our type is obliged to work so much more than others, both on his inner equipment, which creates the life of the part, and also on his outer physical apparatus, which should reproduce the results of the creative work of his emotions with precision. Speech is music. The text of a part or play is a melody, an opera, or a symphony. Pronunciation on the stage is as difficult an art as singing. It requires training and a technique bordering on virtuosity. Those method actors and teachers who do not concern themselves with the development of the necessary physical equipment of the actor, pursue only one phase of the Method.

"One of the greatest values of the Method is its flexibility. The Method is an acting approach based on human behavior. Each generation behaves differently, and is motivated differently, albeit it from the same emotional, physical, and intellectual wells.

"Other acting approaches will use a standard pattern of gestures, attitudes, and inflections within a more-or-less unchanging style; what Stanislavsky does is give us a way to achieve the physical expression of our emotional drives, the behavior patterns they demand, in a manner that is absolutely truthful, yet individual, and imaginative — and contemporary, through involvement with the character. Stanislavsky contends that the actor must become involved with the character's problems and feelings to such a degree that he can ultimately think, feel, and behave as the character would — not as an actor would.

"We used what has become the favorite joke about the Stanislavsky system: animal characterizations, and the use of inanimate objects as character aids. To show you how we arrive at the characterizations, we will

first take an exercise in which the player tries to be the animal, concerning herself with the essential characteristics of rhythm, size, weight, walk, intelligence, and emotional attitude. The first image we select is the 'elephant.'

"The player reacted as an ELEPHANT, big, lumbering, slow-thinking, with slow emotional responses. Now doing the monologue and letting the essential characteristics of the animal influence her fully, she becomes the 'elephant-like girl.' She's not an elephant, she's an 'elephant-like girl.' The image shapes the physical attitude, shapes the emotional condition, determines the rhythm.

"The second image we select is 'typewriter.' The player moved and acted in the mechanical characterization.

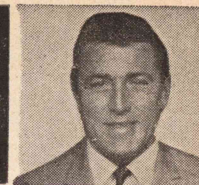
"The third image we use is 'Cat.' Obviously, the audience is not supposed to be aware of what images are being used, if and when they are being used. The actor is supposed to be a human being who has certain characteristics, but the use of the image will help the actor effect a large number of changes in very short order. For the professional, no tool can be as helpful when it is necessary to make major changes on a moment's notice. Every animal or object or idea has some sharp characteristics: spring, summer, winter; locomotive, luxury liner; bikini, evening gown; tiara, ankle bracelet; elephant, mouse; bear, kitten. The truth of the matter is, many of us are walking images. Look around you; you're sure to find a collie, a black lace bra, a sparrow...

Now, do you know, too?  
And that's Hollywood!

STEVENS LANTS: You're a very "out" art addict if you haven't glimpsed Turner at the Museum of Modern Art. . . . The fun of going to market for delicious and rare Southern European foods is all there for the buying — on Ninth Avenue in the upper Thirties and lower Forties. . . . The New York Yankees infield is comprised personally of Joe Pepitone's high share of ego, Bobby Richardson's humility, Cleto Boyer's tenacity and Tommy Tresh's suppression as a folk singer. . . . The freshness, originality and verve get through to you in the very entertaining South African revue, "Wait a Minim!" The John Golden Theatre hasn't been put to better use in years. . . . At the Lincoln Center Promenades, Andre Kostelanetz proved what it means to be a classy stick waver. Kosty is a vital talent in the conducting field. . . . Over at Gallagher's Steak House, where the chopped beef may be the finest in town and general manager Dick Conlon's geniality abounds with good fellowship, the wall devoted to baseball greats of yesteryear is cause for concern in this corner. A 1923 photo of Edd Roush, the great Cincinnati outfielder, is spelled "Raush" and a picture taken the same year of Ross Pep Youngs, the New York Giants star, is in view without the "s" on the last name. There is, however, a human interest item to report, perhaps a balance for the two errors. We spotted a 1929 print of Al Schacht as a Washington Senators' coach. Now that's nice. The Clown Prince of Baseball, a long time restaurateur, is opening a new East Side spot soon. The continued free advertising via name and likeness association for Schacht in Gallagher's gets our genuflection for

one Jerome Brody. . . . The word that the Waldorf's Empire Room will reopen in the Fall and headline Chevalier is a happy item to report. . . . Ahamad Meah's comfortable, convenient Karachi Restaurant has many superb dishes, to be sure. The last time we dined there in the company of a novice, in regard to Indian food, we found the best liked item at our table was the Samosa, a meat cake indigenous to the South Asians. . . . Overheard on Park Avenue: "New York is certainly a great city to visit, but I wouldn't want to stay too long. I just might end up living here."

Eat Treat: In our boyhood days, Chinese food was chop suey and chow mein to the average big city American and Polynesian fare was something less — pineapple and chicken, maybe. Then everybody went Oriental and egg rolls were in flavor favor and a whole renaissance period started.

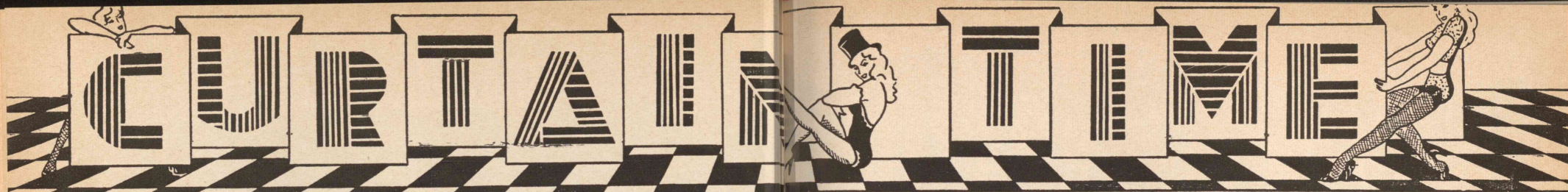

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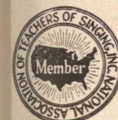

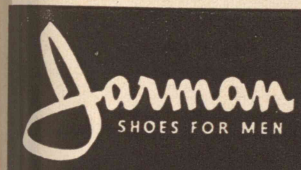

In a glittery, shocking pink chemise, matching boots, gloves, and cigarette holder, her hair coiffed a la hair-raising, the fastest rising comedienne in show business gets giggles on entrance, and screams from there on in. Teeing off on her favorite target, herself, Diller rocks the room with her beauty problems, marital problems, and — funniest of all — her experiences at the helm of the family car. It's a gem of an act, the riotous material fielded expertly by Phyllis of the raucous laugh and lovable charm. I trust she will forgive me for tampering with her image, but did you ever notice that when she isn't mugging, she is a very pretty woman? . . . Although I have long admired Enzo Stuarti, blessed with one of the most magnificent voices of our day, I was never as completely disintegrated by

his vocal power as I was on his opening night this trip. The handsome Roman is singing so superbly it's ovation time straight through his program, whether he's swinging "Come Prima," or tearing everyone apart with his aria from "Pagliacci." In addition to his thrilling singing voice and lyrical sensitivity, he speaks so beautifully as in his moving introduction to "Exodus," and he also has a flair for comedy, which he is now wisely exploiting in a witty monologue tying together the song segments. Can't resist a pun — he's the livin' Enzo. . . . Sherman Frank is Stuarti's musical conductor. . . . Gig and Ginger, young, handsome, and accomplished dance team open the show, backed by the Russ Black Orchestra.

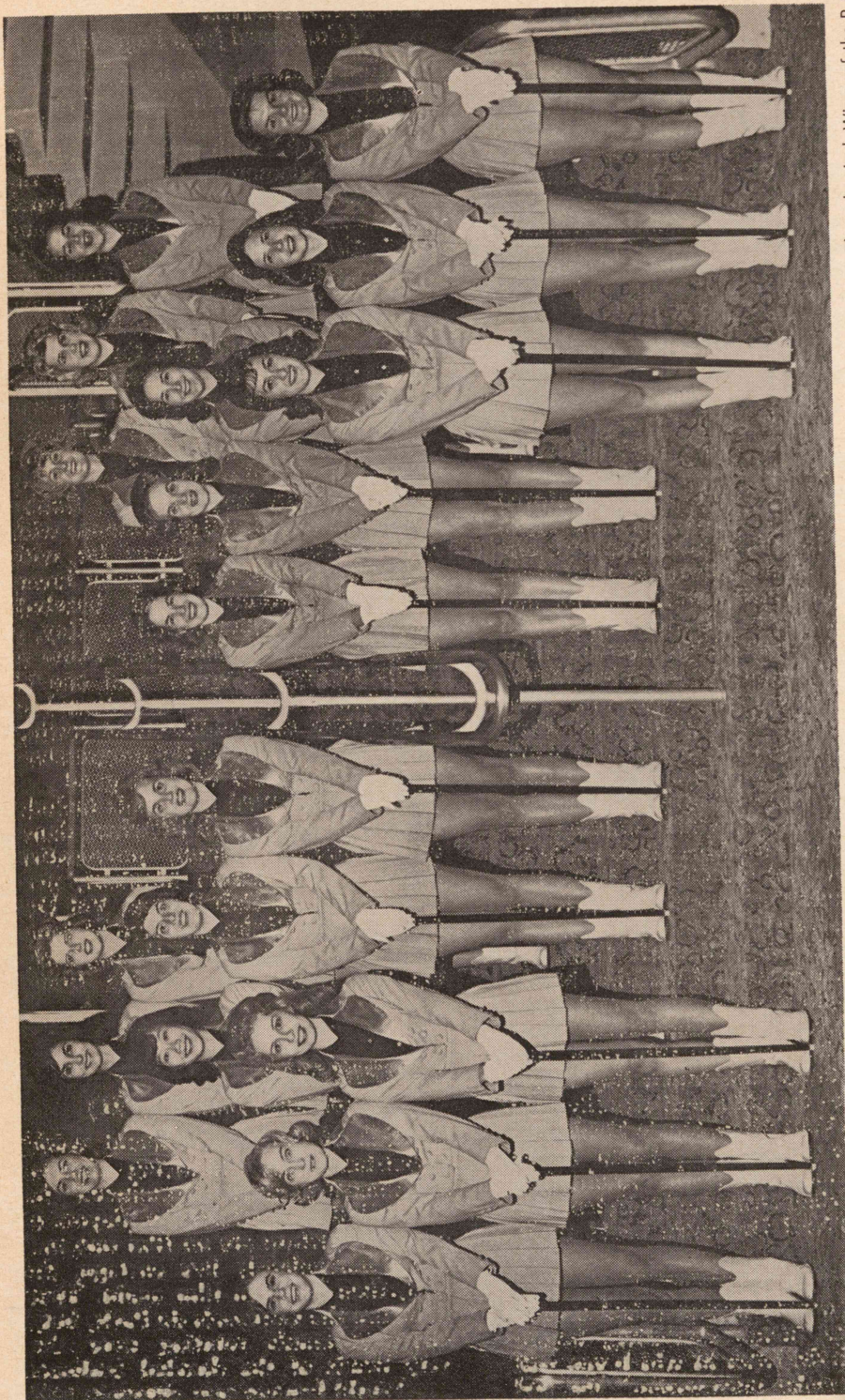
